

STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

February 17, 1965

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman at 1:30 p.m. Mr. Larry Smith was introduced, who in turn introduced Major Arch Roberts, who discussed his feelings that the United Nations has too much power over the states and the individuals of the nation; that he sees the building of UN army troops and the reduction of the US troops as a danger, particularly in the light that the UN forces are under the control of a Soviet communist and have been since the birth of the UN. He states that such people as Alger Hiss and Philip C. Jessop were the authors of the original UN Charter, and that this is a poor start. He states that in all theatres of conflict for the past several years-- in Korea and now Viet Nam, that the UN knows exactly what we are going to do before we do it, and since the forces are under the control of the communists, naturally we never win. He suggests that the states should adopt a resolution declaring the UN Treaty null and void.

After questions by members of the Committee, those who appeared were excused and the Chairman asked Mr. Fribley to discuss H.B. 617.

Mr. Fribley stated that this bill would set up a no-salary commission, at the request of the Governor, to further and preserve culture and art in Kansas.. There was discussion by the Committee as to the membership of the commission and how the commission would be financed.

Discussion was resumed on S.B. 1, and it was moved by Mr. Rogers and seconded by Mr. Buchele that the bill be recommended favorably. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Ford introduced his guest, Dan Sullivan, and stated that he is the grandson of a former member of the House.

Meeting was adjourned.
