February 4, 1965

Senator Arthur presented the subcommittee report concerning the Kansas State Reception and Diagnostic Center's request to modify the building plans for a new trustees' dormitory under construction at the Center. Senator Arthur moved that the subcommittee report be adopted. Senator Ward seconded the motion, and the motion carried unanimously. The subcommittee report is attached to and made part of these minutes.

Mr. Bibb then briefed the Committee on the method of budget preparation, using the Budget Division's instruction booklet as his guide.

Location and Nature of Project:

Better utilization of space originally planned for kitchen.

Authorized by Senate bill 321# General session of 1963.

In moving the storeroom and maintenance shops to the basement of the new dormitory, only two business offices remain in the old condemned building, namely the business mgrs office and the accounting department.

In the original plans of the new dormitory, space was provided for a kitchen, however, a small institution to operate two kitchens was impractical and expensive. This space would be better utilized by moving the two business service offices into this area and vacating the presently occupied building. A big savings on heat, electricity and maintenance could be effected.

1. Change recommended by acting Supt. Nova F. Stucker.
2. No additional funds needed.
3. Mr. Kaiser, chief chef, at the Center stated that the cost would practically ^{be} doubled by operating two kitchens instead of one.
4. Mr. Kaiser also stated that the present kitchen was not over-crowded and was operating very efficiently.

Population at the Diagnostic Center will not vary in numbers to any marked degree.

Committee Recommendations:

That the change in plans be allowed as stated above with the following requirements.

That the utility connections as originally planned be installed, in case that at some future date a population increase would warrant another kitchen, it could be installed at a minimum of cost.

This recommendation is made due to the advanced stage of planning and construction already underway.
