

SENATE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

Minutes of the Meeting  
February 8, 1965

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m., February 8, 1965, by Chairman Sanborn. All members were present. Also present was State Budget Director James Bibb; and Mr. Kent Sanborn of Shawnee Mission, Kansas, was a visitor.

Senator Smith asked that consideration be given to the introduction as Committee bills the following:

1. A bill to amend K.S.A. 75-1005 to permit State colleges and universities under the jurisdiction of the Board of Regents to exempt the printing of scholarly books from the provisions of this act. In effect, the bill would allow the printing of these books by privately-owned printing plants.

Senator Smith moved that such a bill be introduced as a Committee bill with the understanding that it be referred back to the Committee. Senator Bowers seconded the motion; and the motion carried unanimously.

2. A bill to amend K.S.A. 76-6a01 to bring Wichita State University under the educational building fund.

Senator Ward moved that it be introduced as a Committee bill. Senator Smith seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

3. A bill to change the title of the position of Executive Secretary of the Board of Regents to Executive Officer. The bill would not affect the salary of the position, only change the title.

Senator Smith moved that the Committee approve the change in title and that a bill be introduced as a Committee bill. Senator Saar seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously carried.

4. A bill to amend K.S.A. 76-8601 to provide statutory authority to the Board of Regents to contract for use of private funds in the construction and operation of student union on campuses of State colleges and universities, particularly Wichita State University.

Senator Smith moved that a bill be introduced and recommended for passage. Senator Arthur seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously carried.

The Budget Director then discussed in detail the State's civil service procedures for personnel administration.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, it was adjourned at 11:00 a.m.
