

MINUTES

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

SPECIAL SESSION

March 1, 1966

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Sanborn at 9:00 AM, March 1st, 1966. All members were present with the exception of Senators Van Sickle, Saar, Liebert and Smith.

HOUSE BILL 503 was introduced for consideration by the committee. Mr. Bibb of the Budget Division explained that this appropriation of \$150,000 would cover the remainder of the Special Session of the Legislature now in progress and would leave a surplus in the event of an emergency arising before the next regular session. The appropriation made for the Budget Session included an appropriation for the Special Session for two weeks but as the length of the Special Session is exceeding that time it is necessary that a new appropriation be made. It was explained that it costs about \$6,800 per day, excluding printing to operate. During the Budget Session it cost approximately \$8,500 per day but that it would be less during the Special Session as there will be much less printing cost.

The other two items in this bill are routine appropriations to take care of expenses after the session closes.

It was moved by Senator Warren, seconded by Senator Bell, that House Bill 503 be recommended for passage. Motion carried.

It was explained by Senator Sanborn that the two bids already received for the new stenographer's desks are very high and he, together with the Sargent at Arms Mr. White, is attempting to get some other bids. It was suggested that Mr. Knouft be contacted as he was instrumental in securing the good price paid for the present desks.

Meeting adjourned.
