

STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

March 10, 1967

The meeting was called to order with all members present except Mr. Brown, who was excused.

The Chairman called for action on HCR 1018. Mr. Doyen moved that it be reported adversely. Mr. Turner seconded the motion which carried with one dissenting vote.

Mr. Buchele moved that HCR 1019 be reported adversely. Upon second by Mr. Rogers the motion carried with a vote of 9 to six.

Mr. Rogers moved that H.B. 1142 be reported adversely. Motion was seconded by Mr. Jelinek and carried 13 to 2.

Mr. Buchele moved that H.B. 1454, as amended, be recommended favorably. Upon second by Mr. Rogers, the motion carried unanimously.

Mr. McGill moved that HCR 1017 be recommended favorably. Motion was seconded by Mr. Jelinek and carried 13 to 1.

Mr. McGill moved that H.B. 1251 be recommended favorably. Motion was seconded by Mr. Ford and carried unanimously.

Mr. McGill moved that S.B. 25 be recommended favorably. Motion which was seconded by Mr. Buchele carried 16 to 1.

Mr. Doyen moved that H.B. 1231 be recommended adversely. Upon second by Mr. McGill, motion carried 12 to 2.

Mr. Bunten moved that H.B. 1255 be reported adversely. Mr. Rogers seconded the motion which carried 13 to 2.

Mr. Jelinek moved that H.B. 1330 be reported adversely. Motion was seconded by Mr. Ford and carried with a vote of 15 yes, with Mr. Mikesic voting no. With regard to this bill the Chairman stated that Mr. Holt had asked permission to remove his name as one of the sponsors; that if there was no objection this would be so granted. There was no objection.

Mr. Turner presented amendments on H.B. 1301 which were requested by the Home Builders Association, explaining that this will exempt them from the law; and further providing a grandfather clause. He then moved the adoption of the amendments. Mr. Rogers seconded the motion which carried unanimously. Thereupon, Mr. Andrews moved that H.B. 1301, as amended, be reported favorably. Request was then made for a secret ballot, and when the ballots were polled, the vote was 11 in favor and 7 opposed to the bill. It was declared recommended favorably, as amended.

Meeting was adjourned.
