The attached Table X was prepared at the request of the Committee to show the relationship of Committee membership in the Legislative Council and the legislature. Column 2 of the table shows the Council Committee assignments for the biennium and Column 3 shows the committee assignments of these persons in the 1967 Kansas Legislature.

It should be noted that two members of the most recent Council did not return to the legislature in 1967. The last (1965-1966) Council membership is used as the illustration. Other Councils might have a slightly different pattern.

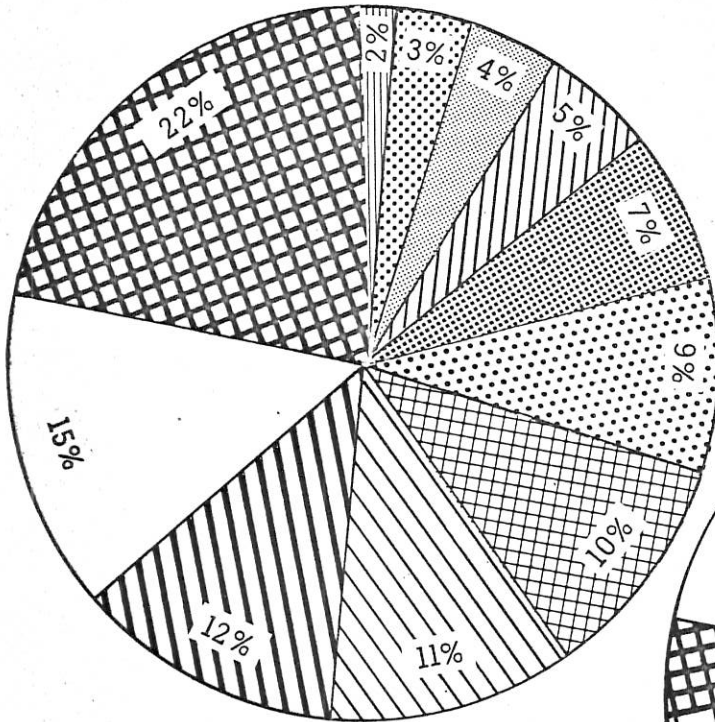

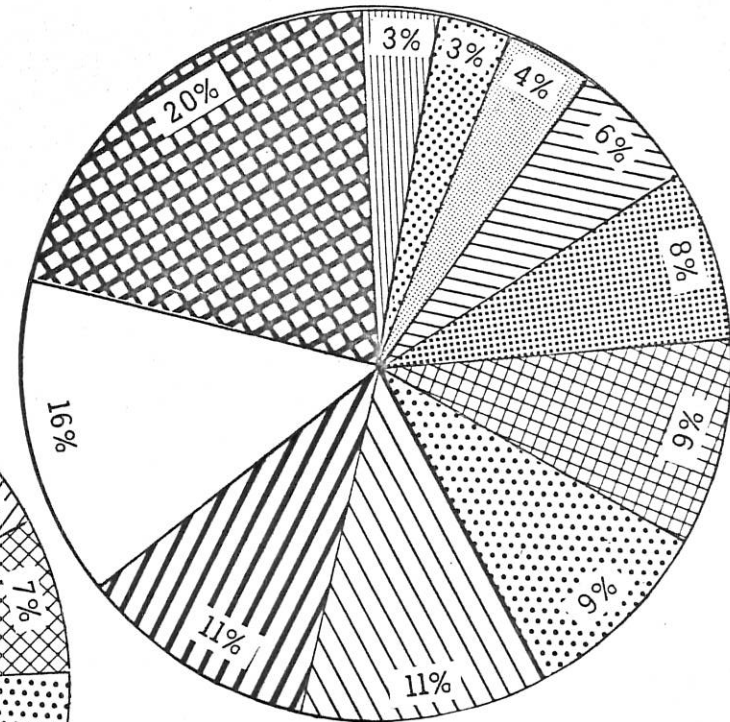

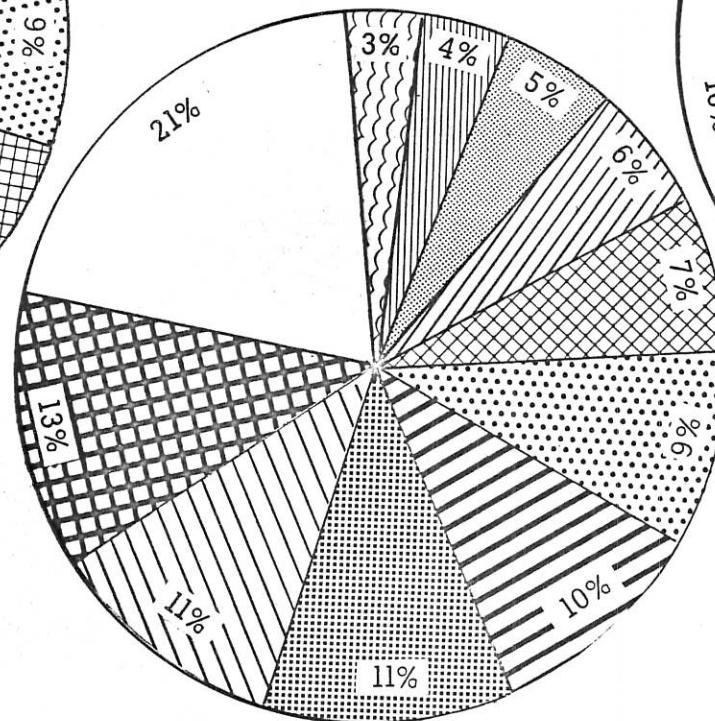
Total Work Load By Committee (A and B Combined)






COMBINED BILL LOAD FOR HOUSE COMMITTEES 1965, 1967, and 1968 SESSIONS

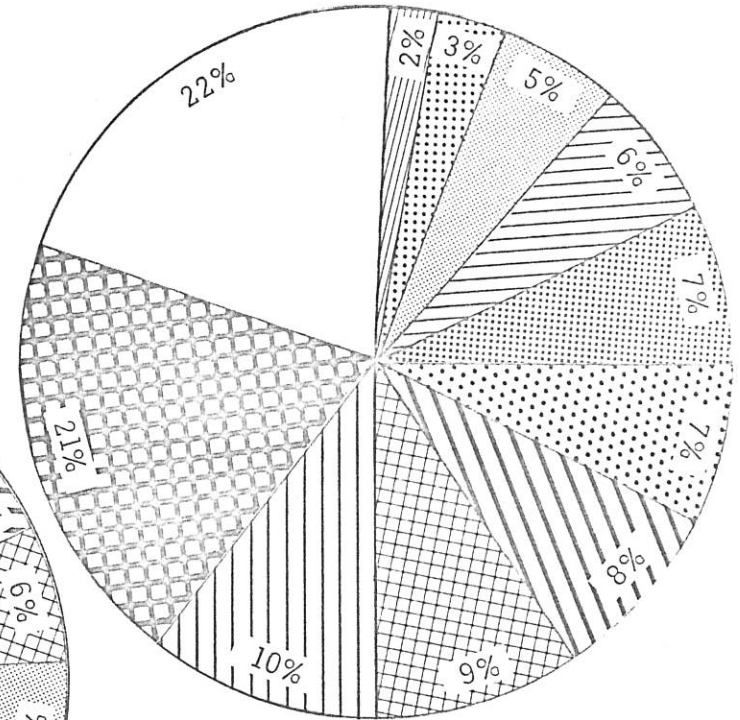

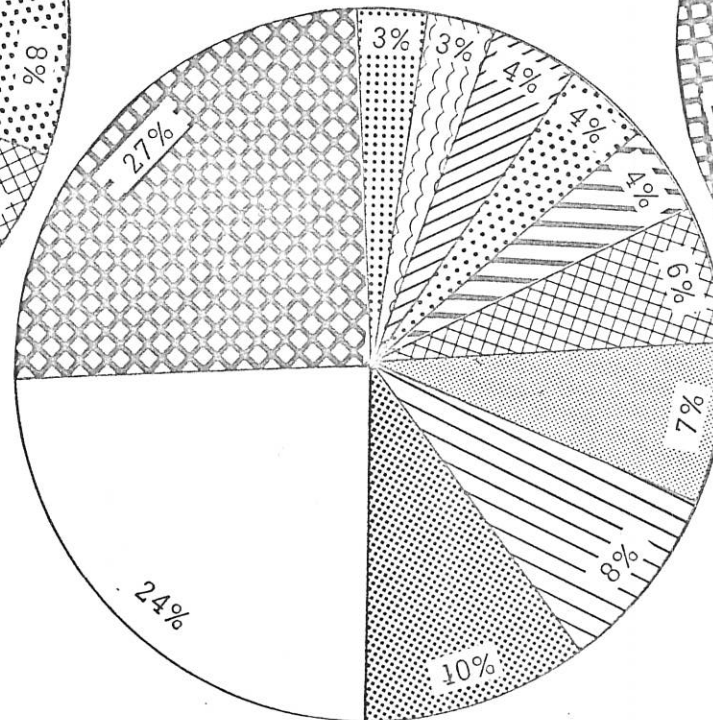
Total Work Load By Committee (A and B Combined)





EXPLANATION

The table shows the disposition of House and Senate bills for the 1965, 1967, and 1968 Sessions. Resolutions are not included in this data. The 1966 Budget Session was omitted because the data would not reflect accurately the committee work in view of the present annual sessions arrangement.

For 1968, the figures in parentheses show the portion of the committee workload resulting from carryover legislation from the 1967 Session on which some action was taken in 1968. A number of "carryover" bills were assigned to committees in 1967 (total - 323) for consideration in 1968. The committees to which these bills were assigned received credit for them as a portion of their workload in 1967. If no action was taken on them in 1968, they are not reflected as part of the 1968 committee workload. The 1968 figures show, for example, that of the 70 House bills that were reported on by the House Education Committee, 21 were carried over from 1967. There may have been other carry-over House bills in the Education Committee, but no action was taken on them in 1968 and, therefore, they are not included on the table.

Columns three and six show numbers of bills reported on by each committee. These figures include bills recommended for passage, bills reported without recommendation and bills recommended unfavorably.

The total number of bills introduced during 1965, 1967 and 1968 is not identical to the totals obtained by adding columns two and five or eight for the three-year period. For example, bills assigned to the Committee of the Whole rather than to a standing committee are not counted. After introduction, these bills do not constitute a part of the workload of the standing committees. Committee sponsored bills are listed separately in column A on the table. Bills reported out of a standing committee which were subsequently re-referred to one or more standing committees are counted as a part of the workload of the committees to which such bills were re-assigned. This means that one bill might be counted two or more times as a part of the total committee workload. Similarly, bills originally assigned to more than one committee are counted as a part of the workload of each committee considering the bill. It was felt that the two types of bills referred to above constituted a part of the total workload of each committee handling the bill.

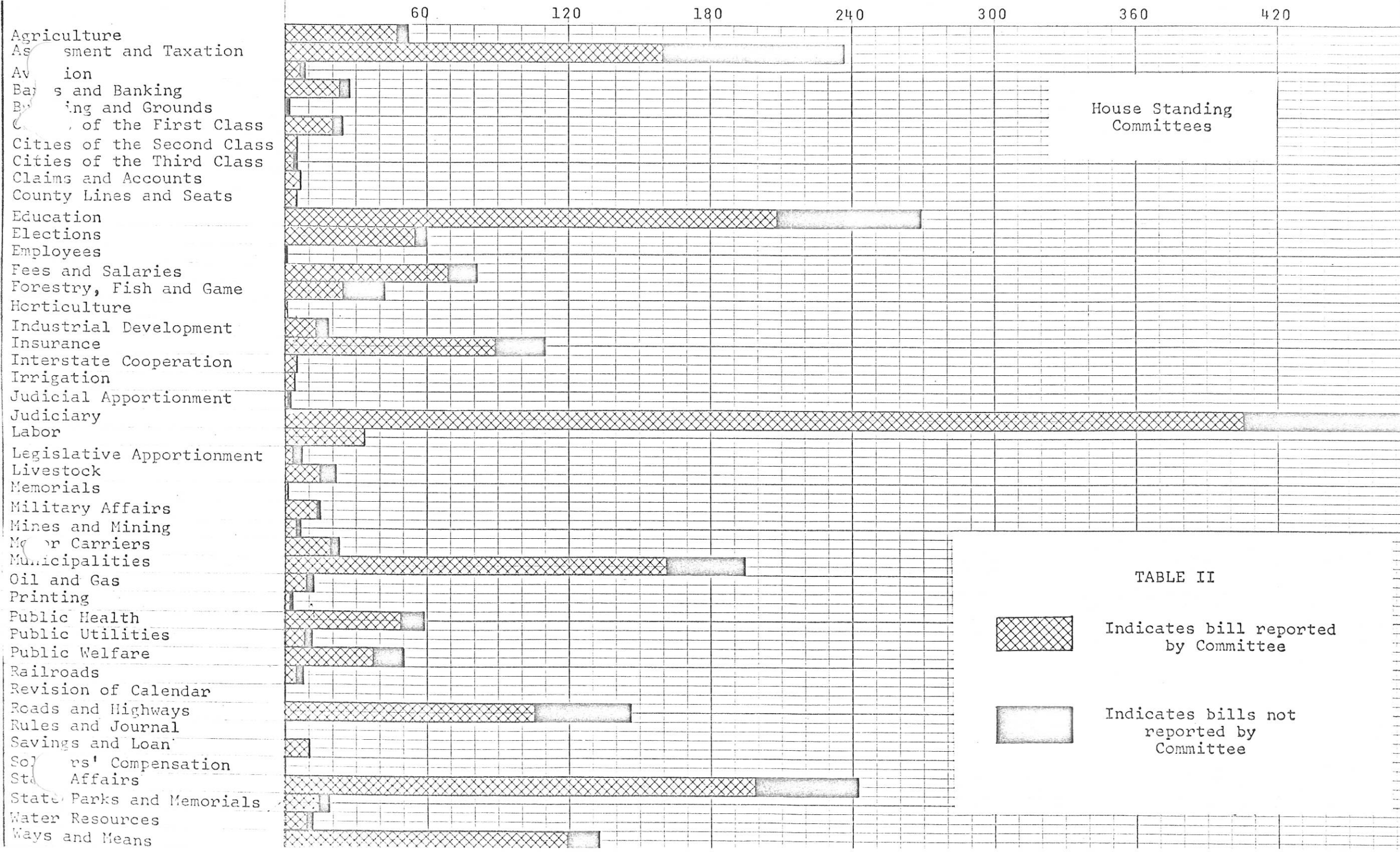

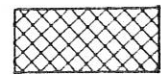

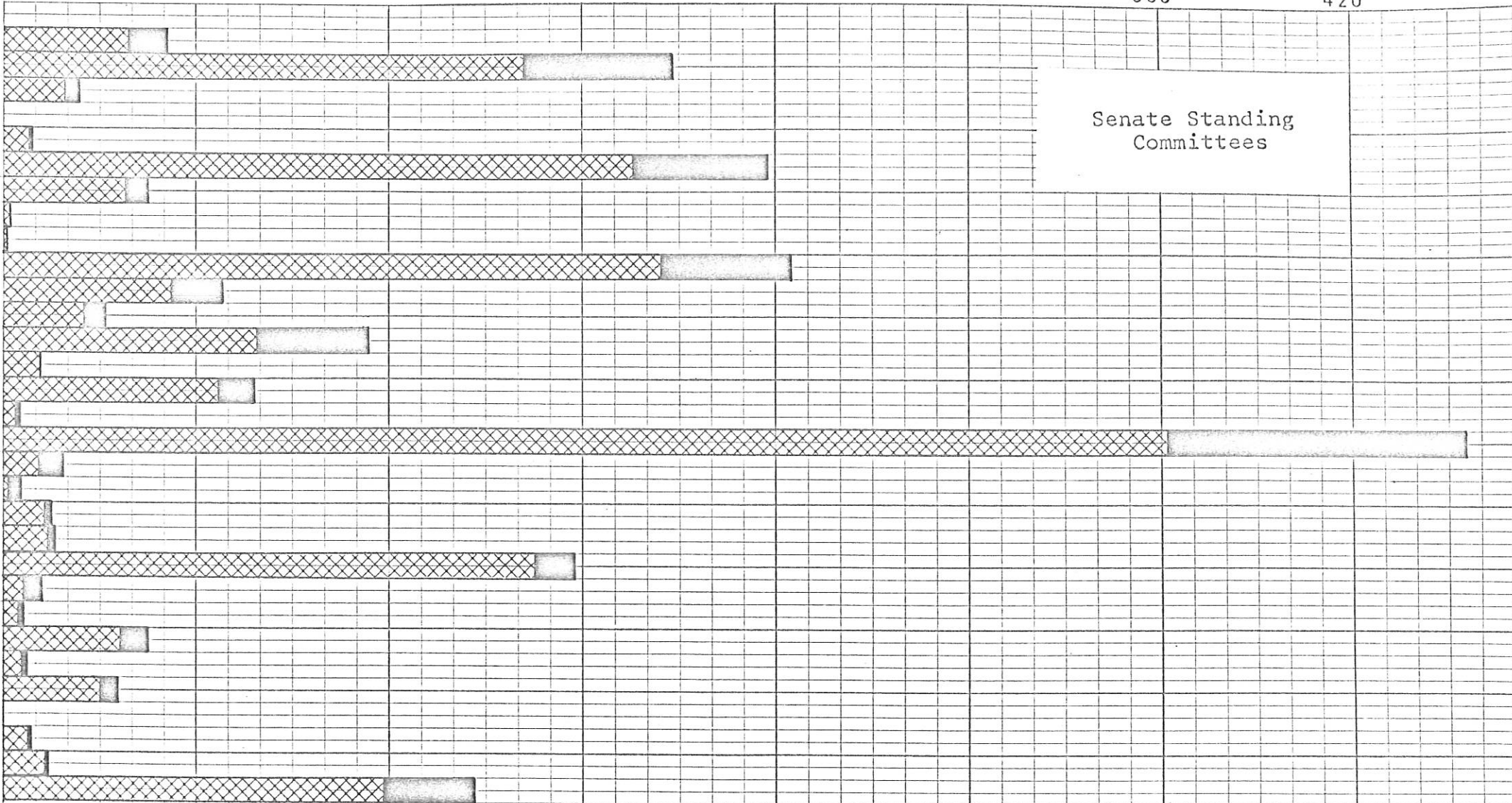

EXPLANATION

The bill locators for 1967 and 1968 were used to identify all bills referred to one or both Judiciary Committees. Categories on the table were arbitrarily selected. They seemed appropriate for the type of bills assigned to the Judiciary Committees for those years. However, other categories could also be selected for dividing the workload. For example, the heading "Traffic" might be used. On this table, traffic matters can be found under at least three of the headings. A number of the bills assigned to one particular category might just as easily have been assigned to some other category.

The table includes all 1967 and 1968 bills referred to a Judiciary Committee. The supporting data identifies the bills by number, accompanied by the bill locator caption. Carry-over bills are also identified. Concurrent resolutions calling for constitutional amendments are shown separately under data for the Senate Judiciary Committee. Constitutional amendments are handled by other substantive committees in the House.

Bills drafted to amend or repeal obsolete provisions which are provided to the Judiciary Committee by the Revisor of Statutes are also included. In determining possible subcommittee work assignments in future sessions, certain factors should be considered. For example, in 1969 recommendations of the Judicial Council on the criminal code and possible revision of procedures before courts of limited jurisdiction might result in unusually heavy workloads in certain areas.
