On July 14, 1967, I stopped in Des Moines, Iowa for a pre-arranged visit with officials of that state concerning their computerized legislative index. My visit was arranged by Mr. Allen E. Reyhons, Director of the Iowa Legislative Research Bureau. The Iowa legislative index is prepared nominally under the direction of the Chief Clerk of the House and the Chief Clerk of the Senate of the Iowa Assembly. The actual work of preparation is done under the direction of Mr. Vern Tanner, Chief of Data Processing in the office of the State Controller, in the State Office Building. Mrs. Marian Gunton, State Controller's Office, State House, Des Moines, Iowa does a large part of the work and supervises preparation of the legislative index. Mrs. Gunton is assisted by Mrs. Juanita Swackhammer and by a student, Mr. Denny Linder.

I conferred with the people listed above for about three hours and Mr. Tanner gave me a tour of the Iowa Central Data Processing installation. There are several facts which I will set out in this memorandum; basically the description already submitted to the Committee is valid and describes the existing mechanism of preparation of the legislative index. Copies of forms and printouts currently used in Iowa are also submitted with this Memorandum:

1. Mr. Tanner made the following estimates:

(a) The Legislative Index as operated in Iowa would take about one man-year of programing, but it was initially done in Iowa in about six weeks by several programmers. The nightly update of data requires about three hours of key punching and verifying and about five minutes of machine time. Three printouts with four carbons on each run requires about 25 minutes of the machine printer's time at about thirty cents per minute.

2. Florida and Michigan are other states that have adopted this method of legislative index. The Florida system is operated on a computer acquired by and for the legislature itself.

3. Both Mr. Tanner and Mrs. Gunton recommend that the data processing programmer and the person who supervises preparation of the index should visit the Iowa Installation and perhaps also the Florida and Michigan Installations, as much will be learned that cannot be communicated in any other way.

4. The reason for placing the Iowa Legislative Index in their controllers' office relates partly to the large data processing installation available, and partly to the belief that operation under a joint legislative committee was preferable to assignment of this service to any other office which might have performed this work.

The Iowa people are very well satisfied with the product of their labors, and they are obviously very dedicated and enthusiastic about their work.
