Chairman Norman E. Gaar called the meeting to order.

Mr. Ron Baxter of the State Barber's Association appeared before the committee to testify in regard to Senate Bill #512. Recommendations were: existing regulations to pertain to schools statutory; remove exemption, would like cosmetologists to be required to have barber license and thus prevent those cosmetologists advertising themselves as such from practicing barbering without barber license; allow the barber board to license for any ten (10) days any barber or teacher from out of the state for the purpose of holding a Barber Show. Discussion was held on the differences between a cosmetologist and a barber. Mr. Baxter stated the State Barber's Association would like for the cosmetologists to obtain a barber license and follow the barber code, and believes both Boards could have a mutual agreement on this. Mr. Baxter will present a written amendment to the committee and will present a short brief on the problem of the age requirement for intering schools, 16 vs. 18, to the committee Thursday, January 27, 1972.

Senator Gaar said the committee will probably hear the cosmetologists next week.

Senate Bill #146, relating to employees of the state of Kansas; concerning payment for unused sick leave in certain cases, will be scheduled by Senator West for hearing Tuesday, February 1, 1972.

The proposed amendment of The Kansas Act ^{against} ~~for~~ Discrimination will be scheduled for hearing Thursday, January 27, 1972. Mr. Joe Doherty will present the substance of the bill.

The committee will meet Thursday morning, January 27, 1972 at 9:00.

Amendment to K.S.A. 65-1809

The Barber Board shall have authority to license barbering seminars and special courses for limited periods of time not to exceed ten days provided such teachers are licensed and accredited barbers or teachers in any other state.
