Chairman Norman E. Gaar called the meeting to order.

Hearing on H.B. 1290. Mr. Charles Wright and Mr. Jim Yount discussed with the committee the suggestion of amending this bill by including "and recognized trade unions" on line 4, 6, 10. Senator Gaar asked Mr. Wright and Mr. Yount to get together and work out the amendment and bring it back to the committee.

Hearing was held on Dr. M. Jarvin Emerson to the Office of Economic Analysis. Dr. Emerson is a professor of economics at K.S. and this is a reappointment to him. Senator Pomeroy made the motion that the governor's appointee be confirmed with Senator Robinson seconding. Vote 8-0. Carried. Dr. Emerson is hereby confirmed.

Mr. Clarence Rupp and Mr. Bill Mitchell testified before the committee on H.B. 1290 and asked that this bill be amended to authorize the withholding of monies for group insurance policies. Mr. Rupp further stated the Kansas companies are cooperating on this.

H.B. 1387 discussed. Senator Pomeroy made the motion to amend this on page 3, line 18, page 4, line 1, 9, 15, by striking "1970" and inserting "1971" and by inserting "1972" on line 15 page 4. Senator Booth seconding. Vote 8-0. Carried. H.B. 1387 is hereby amended. Senator Robinson suggested amending this further and will have the bill drafting department work this for the committee. The committee voted on the substance of the amendment with Senator Robinson making the motion and Senator Thomas seconding. Vote 8-0. Carried. H.B. 1387 is hereby amended. Senator Thomas made the motion that H.B. 1387 be reported favorable for passage as amended with Senator Robinson seconding. Vote 8-0. Carried. H.B. 1387 is hereby reported favorable for passage as amended.

H.B. 1762 discussed and will let set for awhile, 1776, 1996, 1929 were discussed and no action taken.

H.B. 1994 discussed and Senator Pomeroy made the motion to report this bill favorable for passage with Senator Robinson seconding. Vote 8-0. Carried. H.B. 1994 is hereby reported favorable for passage.

Senator Herd seconded. Vote 9-0. Carried. H.B. 1659 is hereby amended. Senator Robinson made the motion to report H.B. 1659 favorable for passage as amended with Senator Herd seconding. Vote 9-0. Carried. H.B. 1659 is hereby reported favorable for passage as amended.

H.B. 1646 discussed. Senator Herd made the motion to report H.B. 1646 favorable for passage with Senator West seconding. Senator Foster made a substitute motion to amend H.B. 1646 to restore the stricken language back to the bill in regard to the 5'2" height requirement for policemen. Senator Robinson seconding. Vote 8-2 with Senator Herd and Senator West voting no. Carried. H.B. 1646 is hereby amended. Senator Pomeroy made the motion to amend H.B. 1646 further by stating that there be no height restrictions as pertaining to other occupations. Senator Foster seconding. Vote 8-1. with Senator Thomas voting no. Carried. H.B. 1646 is hereby amended. Senator Foster made the motion to report H.B. 1646 favorable for passage as amended with Senator Robinson seconding. Vote 9-0. Carried. H.B. 1646 is hereby reported favorable for passage as amended.
