
The Committee considered the following items:

A RESOLUTION relating to the rules of the House of Representatives for the 1975-1976 biennium.

1 *Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of*
2 *Kansas:* That a new rule 60 be added as follows:

3 Section XII. LIMITING DEBATE

4 Rule 60.—*Limiting debate.* Upon the affirmative vote of a ma-
5 jority of all members then elected (or appointed), debate may be
6 closed at a time not less than one hour from the adoption of a
7 motion to that effect, and such motion having been made, no other
8 motion except to adjourn or to take recess shall be entertained
9 until the motion to close debate and fix an hour for the vote upon
10 the pending question shall have been decided.
