


MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY

Senate Bill 611 - Probate code, decree of descent ten or more years after decedent's death. Following committee discussion, Senator Parrish moved to report the bill favorably; Senator Simpson seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

Senate Bill 553 - Juvenile code revision. The staff distributed copies of the ballooned version of the bill which showed amendments that had previously been adopted by the committee. Senator Parrish moved to amend the bill on page 10 concerning the suspension of license of driver's licenses of juveniles; Senator Steineger seconded the motion. Following committee discussion, the motion failed.

Senator Simpson moved that subsection b of section 11 on page 13 be amended to provide all records be available at the discretion of the judge; Senator Hein seconded the motion. Following committee discussion, Senator Simpson withdrew his motion. Senator Parrish then moved that section 11 become new section 3; Senator Simpson seconded the motion, and the motion carried. On page 16, Senator Parrish moved to delete the language "and files an affidavit showing these facts"; Senator Burke seconded the motion, and the motion carried. Senator Parrish moved to amend the bill on page 18 to allow the judge to request the procedure; following discussion, Senator Parrish withdrew his motion. Senator Simpson moved that the judge be eliminated from filing the petition, and that the filing be delegated to the prosecutor; Senator Allegrucci seconded the motion, and the motion carried. Senator Hess moved to amend the bill <sup>on</sup> page 22 to eliminate the 30 day requirement; Senator Simpson seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

SB 553

Senator Parrish moved to amend the bill on page 28 to provide that all options would be available; Senator Hess seconded the motion, and the motion carried. Senator Parrish moved to amend the bill on page 29 to provide for counseling for juveniles; Senator Hess seconded the motion, and the motion carried. Senator Hess moved to further amend that provision; Senator Parrish seconded the motion, and the motion carried. Senator Hess moved to report the bill favorably as amended; Senator Parrish seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

Senate Bill 825 - Juvenile code revision. Following committee discussion, Senator Parrish moved to report the bill adversely because SB 553 had been selected as the vehicle. Senator Hess seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

Senate Bill 212 - Age of juveniles subject to the provisions of the Kansas Juvenile Code. Senator Hess moved to report the bill adversely; Senator Parrish seconded the motion, but the motion failed.

Senate Bill 761 - Juveniles committing certain crimes may be prosecuted like adults. Senator Parrish explained the bill, pointing out that it is a way of dealing with serious offenders. Senator Parrish moved to amend the bill to include the crime of aggravated sodomy; Senator Hein seconded the motion, and the motion carried. Senator Parrish moved to amend the bill on page 2 dealing with the amenability procedures; following committee discussion, the motion was withdrawn. Senator Hein moved to report the bill favorably as amended; Senator Mulich seconded the motion, and the motion carried, with Senator Hess being recorded as voting "No."

The meeting adjourned.
