Substitute for House Bill 2712 - Crimes and criminal procedure, presentence reports, sentencing, probation conditions, parole eligibility, transfer of probation and parole functions, DOC and KAA regulations. Representative Brewster testified in support of the bill. He explained that the substitute bill had been introduced because of extensive revisions in the original bill as introduced by the interim Judiciary B Committee. All sections of the bill that dealt with material other than sentencing, probation and eligibility for parole were eliminated from the bill, and five of the bills recommended by the interim committee on corrections were combined into this bill. He explained the provisions of the bill.

Representative Hurley testified in support of the bill, and reviewed the provisions of the bill dealing with corrections. The five bills that were incorporated into this bill were HB 3127, HB 3131, HB 3111, HB 3110, and HB 3122. He related that the house committee had worked closely with the Department of Corrections and with the Kansas Adult Authority. He stated that the only part where there was any real discussion or disagreement was on the transfer of probation to the courts. Committee discussion with Representatives Brewster and Hurley followed.

Senate Bill 282 - Adoption and relinquishment of children, rights of putative father. Senator Simpson presented proposed amendments to the bill, and passed out ballooned copies of the proposed amendments. Mr. Griggs explained the proposed amendments in
