


MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY

Senate Bill No. 146 - Reporting abuse of certain persons.

Proposed amendments were passed out which had been suggested by the author of the bill, Senator Meyers. It was pointed out that House Bill 2167 is a similar bill. Committee discussion followed. Senator Gaines moved that the bill be amended by the adoption of the amendments proposed by Senator Meyers; Senator Parrish seconded the motion, and the motion carried. The chairman commented that there is a policy question the committee will have to adopt as to its scope. Senator Allegrucci objected to the criminal immunity in the bill. Senator Gaines moved to report the bill favorably as amended; Senator Parrish seconded the motion. Senator Allegrucci made a substitute motion to strike references to criminal immunity; Senator Hein seconded the motion, and the substitute motion carried. Senator Gaines moved to report the bill favorably as amended; Senator Parrish seconded the motion, and the motion carried, with Senator Werts and the chairman voting "No".

Senate Bill No. 164 - Consumer protection, motor vehicles.

The chairman explained the amendments suggested by Senator Feleciano. Following committee discussion, Senator Hein moved to amend the bill as indicated in the ballooned copy; Senator Hess seconded the motion, and the motion carried, with Senator Parrish voting "No". Senator Hein moved to report the bill favorably as amended; Senator Mulich seconded the motion and the motion carried, with Senator Parrish voting "No".

The chairman appointed a subcommittee to work on the juvenile bills that were heard this morning and the ones that will be heard tomorrow; the subcommittee will be composed of Senators Gaines, Hess and Parrish.

Senate Bill No. 326 - Relinquishment of illegitimate children.
The chairman explained that the term "relinquishment" is the term used with regard to situations where the parent is giving the custody of the child to an adoptive agency. Committee discussion followed.

Senate Bill No. 389 - Changes in securities commissioner statutes.
Following committee discussion, Senator Werts moved to amend the bill in line 110 to add "management consultant"; Senator Allegrucci seconded the motion, and the motion carried. Senator Parrish moved that the bill be tabled to be taken up at a more appropriate time; following committee discussion, Senator Parrish withdrew that motion. Senator Hess moved that we take no action during this session; following further discussion, he withdrew that motion.

The meeting adjourned.
