

Senate Bill No. 381 - Appeals in juvenile code severance of parental rights cases. Senator Parrish reported that the subcommittee recommended the bill be passed. Following committee discussion, Senator Parrish moved to report the bill favorably; Senator Hein seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

Proposed Substitute for Senate Bill No. 76 - Enacting a tort claims act applicable to the state and local units of government. Committee discussion was had concerning the manner of approval of claims against the state. Senator Hein moved to amend the draft to provide that judgments or settlements would be submitted to the special committee on Claims and Accounts; Senator Burke seconded the motion. Following further committee discussion, the motion carried. Following further committee discussion, Senator Parrish moved to amend the draft to add the sections that were in the original bill dealing with pending law suits not being liens on the property of employees; Senator Mulich seconded the motion, and the motion carried. Following further committee discussion, Senator Steineger moved to amend the draft to provide that the Legislative Coordinating Council would have to approve claims against the state; Senator Hess seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

Following further committee discussion, Senator Hess moved to amend Senate Bill 76 by reporting a substitute bill in accordance with the amended draft presently before the committee; after a long pause, Senator Allegrucci, who was just entering the committee room, seconded the motion. The motion was tied on a vote of one in favor and one opposed until the chairman broke the tie by voting in favor of the motion. Senator Werts then changed his "pass" to "Aye".

The meeting adjourned.
