SB 174 - Time for evaluation of certain school employees.

Representative Hassler moved to report SB 174 favorably. Representative Apt seconded the motion and the motion carried.

SB 344 - School districts, petty cash funds.

Representative Myers moved to amend to place a lid of \$1500 per petty cash fund. Representative Murphy seconded.

Representative Lowther made a substitute motion to leave the existing amounts for enrollment categories and to restore the original language as to location and person responsible for keeping the petty cash fund. Representative Myers seconded and the motion carried.

Representative Leach moved that SB 344 be passed favorably as amended. Representative Lowther seconded and the motion carried.

SB 358 - Recreation commissions, tax levies, resolutions authorizing, protest petition.

Representative Myers moved that SB 358 be reported favorably and Representative Apt seconded. The motion carried.

SB 79 - Boards of education of unified school districts, disqualification for office.

Representative Leach moved to report SB 79 adversely. Representative Hassler seconded.

Representative Moomaw made a substitute motion to amend to apply only to "full-time employees". Representative Apt seconded and the motion failed.

Voting was held on the original motion and the motion carried.

SB 177 - Special education for exceptional children, due process hearings, appointment of hearing officers.

Representative Apt made a motion to amend on line 96 by striking "5" and inserting, in lieu of, "10". Representative Vancrum seconded and the motion carried.

Representative Myers moved to pass SB 177 favorably as amended. Representative Helgerson seconded.

Representative Apt made a substitute motion to amend on lines 53 and 68 by striking "5" and inserting, in lieu of, "10". Representative Polson seconded the motion and the motion failed.

Representative Kline made a conceptual substitute motion to provide that where a district has a trained hearing officer who is acceptable to a parent, such officer can be used. If not acceptable, the State would then provide a hearing officer. Representative Vancrum seconded and the motion carried.

Representative Reardon made a motion that parents be advised of their rights in the due process hearing procedure. Representative Kline seconded and the motion carried.

Representative Myers then moved to pass SB 177 favorably as amended and Representative Kline seconded. The motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned.
