

MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON FEDERAL AND STATE AFFAIRS

The Chairman recognized Director Kennedy. He started his presentation concerning Item No. 11, on the Memorandum from the Alcoholic Beverage Control re: Recommendations covering Legislation this 1983 Year. Item No. 11 deals with Should Kansas statutes be amended to allow for special or temporary permits or licenses for fund raisers, etc? The ABC recommendation is that legislation be introduced to provide for this.

There was much discussion of Item No. 11, and Tom Coleman assisted in answering questions from the committee. The Chairman asked for good suggestions from the committee concerning the various problems in this area.

Director Kennedy directed the committee's attention to Item No. 6: Should restrictions on business operations in the liquor industry that appear to be designed to protect the industry, not the public, be eliminated? The ABC recommends no action at this time, as they are reviewing and studying the matter and will make regulation changes where possible.

Following much discussion the Chairman appointed a sub-committee comprised of Senator Pomeroy, Chairman; and Senator Roitz and Senator Francisco. He asked that they meet with the representatives of the Alcoholic Beverage Control and members of the industry and to report back to the committee with some concrete recommendations.

The meeting adjourned at 12:00 noon.
