MINUTES OF THE Senate COMMITTEE ON Local Government

The meeting was called to order by Senator Gaar at

9:00 a.m./~~p.m.~~ on March 15, 1983 in room 531-N of the Capitol.

All members were present except: Senators Gaines and Mulich, who were excused.

Senator Gaar opened the hearing on H.B. 2028, striking the mailed notice requirement to property owners within 1,000 feet of an area affected by a general zoning resolution. Mr. Kim Dewey addressed the committee in support of the bill. Following discussion, Senator Daniels moved to amend the bill to state that mailed notice of proposed amendments not general revisions include property owners located within 1,000 feet of the affected area, whether within or without the county. Senator Montgomery seconded the motion, and it carried. Senator Montgomery moved to report the bill favorably for passage. Senator Daniels seconded the motion, and it carried with Senator Allen voting no. Senator Gaines was appointed to carry the bill.

Mr. James Kaup spoke in support of H.B. 2168, concerning codification of municipal ordinances. Senator Winter moved to report the bill favorably for passage. Senator Montgomery seconded the motion, and it carried by unanimous vote. Senator Parrish was assigned to carry the bill.

Following a review by the committee, Senator Allen moved and Senator Parrish seconded to report H.B. 2197, concerning creation of special funds of cemetery districts, favorably for passage. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

The committee briefly discussed H.B. 2201, concerning fees for dog licenses, and H.B. 2333, addressing the method of remitting moneys for the redemption of bonds and coupons. Mr. Dewey answered questions and spoke in support of H.B. 2333. No action was taken on either bill pending the scheduled hearings.

Senator Ehrlich moved to approve the minutes of the meeting held March 8, 1983. Senator Montgomery seconded the motion and it carried.

The meeting was adjourned to March 16, 1983.
