Section 2 - Kansas Commission on Civil Rights

Senator Harder presented the subcommittee report on this section, and committee members were given opportunity to question him.

Section 11 - Kansas Arts Commission

Following the explanation of the subcommittee report on this section, there was discussion concerning the Challenge Grant program. There was a question about the Arts Commission matching the \$25,000 appropriated by the state for FY 1983. Mr. Reed said the match was 7 to 1, and the Challenge Grant Program was an important incentive in obtaining the funds. There were questions from committee members about the Artists in Education Program, and Mr. Reed explained how funds are used for that program.

Section 15 - Kansas Soldiers' Home

Senator Harder presented the subcommittee report on this section, and Senator Bogina explained the recommendation of the Joint Committee on State Building Construction contained in Senate Subcommittee Recommendation No. 1.
