

MINUTES OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON ASSESSMENT AND TAXATION

The meeting was called to order by Representative Jim Braden at

The minutes of February 27, February 28, February 29 and March 1, 1984, were approved as printed.

Hearings were scheduled for Senate Bill 723 and Senate Bill 724. Senate Bill 723 would change the procedure by which county treasurers would remit to the State Treasurer state property tax levies for the educational building fund and state institutions building fund. Under existing law, no due dates are specified for the remittance of those moneys. Senate Bill 723 would specify six dates for the remittance of the estimated amount collected for and owed to the state. These dates would be the same as those which are statutorily identified for the remittance by county treasurers of other local unit payments.

Hearings were also scheduled for Senate Bill 724 which would establish six dates upon which county treasurers are to remit the state portion of motor vehicle taxes to the State Treasurer for deposit in the Educational Building Fund and the States Institutions Building Fund.

No conferees appeared on either bill. Representative King made a motion that Senate Bill 723 be reported favorable for passage and Representative Jarchow seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Representative Miller made a motion that Senate Bill 723 be placed on the consent calendar and Representative Frey seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The Chairman called for action on Senate Bill 724. Representative Rolfs made a motion to report Senate Bill 724 favorable for passage and place it on the consent calendar. Representative Adam seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The committee then discussed Senate Bill 515 which would extend the period during which exempt freeport goods may be held in Kansas from two to five years.

Representative Jarchow made a motion that Senate Bill 515 be reported favorable for passage and Representative King seconded the motion.

Representative Rolfs made a substitute motion that the contents of Senate Bill 733 be amended into Senate Bill 515. Senate Bill 733 would amend the "freeport law," to decrease from 35 to 30 percent the minimum percentage of goods to be shipped outside of Kansas to qualify a warehouse or storage area as a freeport. Once the area qualifies, the average inventory of goods shipped outside the state will be exempt. Representative Wunsch seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Representative Jarchow made a motion that Senate Bill 515 be reported favorable for passage as amended and Representative King seconded the motion.

Representative Leach made a substitute motion that Senate Bill 515 be amended from five years to four years. Representative Adam seconded the motion.

The substitute motion failed. The chairman then called for the vote on the original motion to report Senate Bill 515 favorable for passage as amended. The original motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned.
