The meeting of the House Governmental Organization Committee was called to order at 9:04 a.m. by Rep. Stephen R. Cloud, Chairman. The minutes of the February 2 meeting were approved. The Chairman announced that a short meeting with the Vice Chairman, Ranking Minority Member and Subchairpersons would be held upon adjournment.

HB 2721 - Public safety and law enforcement, establish department and provide for secretary thereof.

Rep. Aylward, bill sponsor, gave a brief background of the bill and stated that it is needed to provide effective, efficient and convenient law enforcement to Kansas citizens. The Interim Committee on Infrastructure recommended combining the KBI and Highway Patrol buildings. The bill presents an entirely new concept of combining several agencies as other states have done. There would be a 21 million dollar fiscal note on this bill. (Attachment I) Rep. Aylward introduced several persons from Salinarwho were present for today's hearing. Among those attending were: John F. Burgess, Mayor; Roy Allen and Gerald Shadwick, Salina Chamber of Commerce.

Senator Vidricksen distributed several maps to the committee showing the locations where several of the proposed facilities could be located. (Attachment II)

Rep. Bob Ott stated that this is a new concept in government and we should certainly look into the idea of combining these departments.

Gerald Shadwick stated that Salina has had a history of being very helpful in integrating new businesses and organizations into the community. Various officials, agencies and other entities have commented on the excellent health, educational and cultural advantages of the area; all the things that make life pleasant and enhance its quality. He distributed a publication entitled SALINA There's No Place Like It! (Attachment III)

Ed Pogue, Salina Airport Authority, also gave support to the bill citing good schools, conventions and recreational facilities. The city is located at the hub of many highways.

Rep. Wunch stated that this bill would, at the least, have to be amended to insure the continuation of the law enforcement facilities in his area.

John Neal, Chairman, Greater Hutchinson Chamber of Commerce, distributed copies of his testimony (Attachment IV) and spoke of the concerns his city has about the potential loss of 15 jobs and a \$500,000 annual payroll. He stated that it makes no sense to abandon the Hutchinson facility.

As there was no one else present to speak on HB 2721, the Chairman stated that this constituted the hearing on the bill.

Unless specifically noted, the individual remarks recorded herein have not been transcribed verbatim. Individual remarks as reported herein have not been submitted to the individuals appearing before the committee for editing or corrections.

## A. BASIC PROVISIONS

- (1) Creates Department of Public Safety and Law Enforcement.
- (2) Creates Secretary of Public Safety and Law Enforcement (appointed by Governor).
- (3) Combines Kansas Highway Patrol, Kansas Bureau of Investigation, State Fire Marshal Alcohol and Beverage Control Division of Department of Revenue, Law Enforcement Training Academy and Highway Patrol Training Academy in the Department of Public Safety and Law Enforcement.
- (4) Calls for Department of Public Safety and Law Enforcement to be housed in a Public Safety Building located in Saline County.

## B. HISTORY

- (1) Interim Committee of Infrastructure recommended a Public Safety Building be built to house Kansas Bureau of Investigation and Highway Patrol.
- (2) Governor recommended 850,000 FY-86; 5.5 million FY-87; 9 million FY-88; 5,650,000 FY-89 for a total of 21 million to build such a Public Safety Building.

## C. REASONS FOR CONSOLIDATION OF AGENCIES

- (1) Due to the Interim Committee's and Governor's recommendations, the legislature will be considering construction of a Public Safety Building.
- (2) Twenty-one (21) other states are currently under a similar Secretary-Department System.
- (3) Facilitate cooperation and interaction between law enforcement agencies one person would have final jurisdiction over all branches and they would be in same location.

ALCH. I

- (4) Same location will enable various branches to share laboratories, training facilities and instructors, and communications equipment.
- (5) One location, particularly Salina, would greatly enhance accessibility and convenience for Kansas citizens.

## D. ADVANTAGES OF SALINA LOCATION

- (1) Salina is more accessible to majority of Kansas residents than is Topeka.
- (2) Salina is located at the crossroads of the state's two major interstate highways.
- (3) Salina Airport Authority passed a resolution donating all the land necessary for this facility to the state.
- (4) If located on Salina Airport Authority donated land, it would be adjacent to the landing strips at the former Schilling Air Force Base. These landing strips are currently being used very successfully by the Highway Patrol Training Academy and would be conveient for other training programs.

## E. SUMMARY

The bottom line is that we need to provide the most effective, efficient and convenient law enforcement to Kansas citizens. I believe that, in light of the proposed new Public Safety Building, it is a very opportune time to consider consolidation of the various law enforcement branches into one department with their central location in Salina to achieve this goal.

The heads of the agencies are appointed in a variety of ways. The Fire Marshal and the Superintendent of the Highway Patrol are both appointed by the Governor with the consent of the Senate. The Director of Alcoholic Beverage Control is appointed by the Secretary of Revenue, subject to Senate confirmation. The head of the Highway Patrol Training Academy is in the state classified personnel system. The Director of the Law Enforcement Training Center is also an Associate Director of the Division of Continuing Education at the University of Kansas and is an unclassified individual under the Board of Regents.


#### Surprising opportunities for students of all ages










Nursing care facilities, retirement centers, mental health, and family support services are available.





Good availability of quality labor in Salina stems in part from the self reliance of many native Kansans.

They make their own jobs, if necessary, to remain productive and self sufficient. Employers offering opportunity will find a productive labor pool, able and willing to grow with their businesses. Workers in the Salina area are better educated, skilled and give eight more days productive labor than the national average.

Unemployment rates in Saline County for 1983 varied from a low of 4.7 percent to 7.3 percent for an average of 5.7 percent for the year. Saline County's 1983 average unemployment was 1,450 or 5.7 percent of the labor force.

Salina wage rates are similar to those in other midwestern cities of comparable size. Nominal competition for labor has minimized wage inflation.

Excellent labor-management relations in the Salina area discourage strongly regimented unionization. Kansas is one of 20 states with a "right to work" law.

#### CITY OF SALINA

The city of Salina provides the water, sewerage, and refuse collection service for local residents. Private refuse collectors are also available. The water capacity of the plant is 15 million gallons a day. Average daily consumption is 6,200,000 gallons.

## Kansas Power & Light Company

Kansas Power & Light Company serves the electricity needs of the Salina area. KP&L has adequate generating capacity available for the energy needs of Salina into the 1990's. KP&L has made a commitment to the use of coal - the nation's most abundant fuel - and to burn it cleanly. With its long term coal supply contract and reasonable construction costs, KP&L's most recent generating station, Jeffrey Energy Center, will provide electricity at favorable prices into the next century.

Natural gas is also supplied by Kansas Power & Light Company. Their main system which services the Salina area consistently ranks the lowest in the nation for all classes of customers. They have storage facilities and transmission storage arrangements which augment supply during peak winter-use periods. This combination of low rates and adequate supply are factors in attracting new and existing industry to Salina.

### SOUTHWESTERN BELL TELEPHONE COMPANY

Southwestern Bell Telephone Company provides excellent local and long distance telephone service for the Salina area. The firm has kept pace with the constantly growing need for instant communication.

Recently, Southwestern Bell installed an electronic switching system to provide Salina area customers with the lastest switching arrangements allowing for improved optional calling services.

#### CITY GOVERNMENT

Salina has a commission-manager form of government. Five commissioners are elected by the voters and these persons select one of their number annually to serve as mayor. The mayor presides at meetings of the commission and represents the city at ceremonial functions.

The commission appoints the city manager who directs the dayto-day management of the city government within the policies established by the commission. He appoints heads of city departments and receives reports of their performance. The manager prepares the annual budget and submits it to the commissioners for adoption.

#### County Government

Salina is the county seat for Saline County. Therefore, numerous state and federal offices have located here.

Saline County is governed by a three-man board of commissioners. Intergovernmental cooperation between the city of Salina and Saline County has merited wide attention. An example of this cooperation lies in the financing and construction of the City-County-Board of Education Building at 300 W. Ash Street. Joint city-county use of facilities, equipment, and personnel in a number of governmental aspects is extensive. Therefore, the cost of many of the resulting services to the taxpayers has been materially reduced.

Efficient and well-equipped police and fire departments provide Salina and Saline County with adequate protection and public safety. Salina, with four fire stations, has the newest and most modern fire equipment available. Salina is rated Class 3 by the Insurance Service Office/Kansas Rating Bureau. An electric alarm system, wired to a central office, is available to subscribers to warn against fire and burglary. Salina has an active civil defense organization and mobile radio disaster unit.

#### Kansas Tax System

The Kansas tax system was originally founded on a general property tax, which over the years has been supplemented by various other taxes, including an income tax and a 3% sales and use tax. The State Law of Kansas prescribes that all real and tangible property must be assessed uniformally and equally at 30% of its fair market value.

#### LOCATION

Salina is the largest city nearest the geographical center of the United States, and is the sixth largest city in the State of Kansas with a population of 42,920. The county population is 50,200.

#### Transportation

Airlines Salina operates the former Schilling Air Force Base as a commercial airfield. It has ap-

proximately 26,000 feet of runway, making it one of the world's longest runways. Salina is served by Air Midwest Airlines and Capitol Airlines. Inbound and outbound flights are scheduled seven days a week and link Salina with major airlines at Kansas

City and Wichita, as well as with key cities throughout the state.

Auto Two well equipped taxi companies and three rent-a-car firms supplement private

automobiles for local travel.

Bus Continental Trailways and Greyhound provide inter-city passenger and freight service

in all directions at frequent intervals.

Highways Interstate 135 (north-south) has an interchange with Interstate 70 (east-west). I-70 pro-

vides direct access to Denver, Kansas City, and beyond. I-135 connects Salina with Wichita, Oklahoma City and Dallas. Six exits allow rapid access to both highways

from most areas of the city.

Railroad Three major railroads serve the Salina community. They are Union Pacific, Missouri

Pacific, and Santa Fe.

Trucking Over 20 common carriers serve the Salina community. Distribution services range from

local to transcontinental in scope.

Most of the developed Salina area lies in the Smoky Hill River Valley. Salina has a healthy, four season climate, a contributing factor to longer life expectancy rates than the national average. Extreme temperatures - both high and low - are of short duration.

#### Soil

Soil characteristics involve 2.5 feet to three feet of top soil, up to eight feet of silty clay, and 20 to 40 feet of sand gravel. Bearing capabilities vary from good to excellent.

#### Topography

Salina is mostly level with gentle slopes which provide an adequate surface drainage. Most of Salina is within the flood control levee system constructed by the U.S. Corps of Engineers and the city.

#### Housing

Housing is plentiful in the Salina area. Within the city limits, there are 17,890 housing units. There is a variety of price ranges for rentals and home ownership. There are many attractive subdivisions in various price ranges, and building sites are also available.

#### **E**DUCATION

Kansas ranks tenth in the nation in the percent of individuals 18 years and older who have graduated from high schools, and is above the national average in percentage of college graduates among the general population. Salinans are representative of that educational level.

M: Chairman, my name is John Neal. I'm President of Ineeda Uniform & Linen Service in Hutchinson and also serve as Chairman of the Board of the Greater Hutchinson Chamber of Commerce.

I'm here today to speak in opposition to Section 51 of HB2721 that proposes to move the Law Enforcement Training Center from Hutchinson to Salina.

Obviously, we're concerned about the potential loss of 15 jobs and a \$500,000.00 annual payroll.

It seems obvious to us that unless a new facility were to be constructed, it makes no economic sense to abandon the Hutchinson facility. Over the last 15 years, the State of Kansas has invested a great deal of money to improve the complex. With this being accomplished, surely the legislature would not want to move it somewhere else.

Since 1969, some of the physical improvements have included: the paneling of the administrative offices, new ceilings in the dormitory building, a big improvement was the carpeting of the facility, a major remodeling of the classroom, gymnasium improvements, outfitting the sleeping rooms, and a new driving strip for training purposes.

I have been impressed with the efficient management of the Hutchinson Law Enforcement Training Center. The staff has really worked close together to upgrade the facility to the best of their ability within the budget limitations.

We trust you recognize the value of the facility and will not allow it to be moved to Salina.
