The first speaker on H.B. 2653 was Mr. Phil Wilkes. Mr. Wilkes brought to the attention of the committee that approximately 95% of the businesses in KS would be regarded as small businesses because they employ less than 250 people. And that if this bill was passed with the definition of small business being 250 employees or less that there would be an excessive amount of paper work needed to be done. Mr. Wilkes is not in favor of H.B. 2653. Mr. Wilkes then answered questions of the committee members.

Chairman Douville stated that this bill would affect 50 some odd agencies and that we should contact more of these agencies so that they are aware of this bill and the cost involved, and the work involved. Representative Hensley requested that Mr. Jim Yonally be called to give testimony before the committee. Chairman Douville said he would ask Mr. Yonally to appear.
