The meeting was called to order by Chairman Rex Crowell.

The first order of business for the day was testimony on HB-2663. Representative Jane Aylward, sponsor of the bill, testified before the committee concerning agricultural use exemption from registration of all-terrain vehicles.

Mr. Rick Davis of the Kansas Motorcycle Industry Council, testified in support of HB-2663 and described various ways farmers are using all-terrain vehicles.

Following the testimony, committee members questioned Mr. Davis, and it was ascertained that the all-terrain vehicles do not require registration or license tags for off-road use and the average speed for such a vehicle is 30 miles per hour.

Mr. Denny Burgess testified in support of HB-2663 and pointed out the all-terrain vehicles can go, as the name implies, on all terrains and are economical to operate.

No opponents appeared before the committee.

Chairman Crowell announced that SB-176 would be taken up this week.
