Chairman Rex Crowell called the meeting to order and the first order of business was a hearing on HB-2824.

Mr. Jack Quinlan of Kansas Motor Car Dealers Association testified in favor of HB-2824, and told the committee the bill addresses the problem of having difficulty getting the titles processed and turned around in the hands of the purchaser so they can register their vehicle within the 15 days allowed by the law. At the present time if a title is assigned or an MSO (Manufacturer's Statement of Origin) on a new vehicle is issued, the purchaser is permitted to drive the vehicle on the highways for 15 days prior to registration providing he secures a temporary registration permit from the County Treasurer's office or from the dealer.

Mr. Quinlan pointed out that some of the problems his organization is confronted with are mail delays, difficulty in getting titles back particularly from foreign states, difficulty in getting titles cleared of liens especially from those states who are title-free states, and lien-free states where they may still hold the title. He also stated there are difficulties with financial institutions as far as getting the liens released in spite of the fact KSA 8-135 requires the lien-holder upon notice of the lienor to release the title from the effect of the lien within 10 days after receiving notification by certified mail. Mr. Quinlan stated due to the many delays, his organization is in support of HB-2824 which permits a second temporary 15-day permit to be issued either by the dealer or the County Treasurer.

Chairman Crowell asked how much of the time is the 15-day limitation a problem, is it really a problem with the mail or is it a problem with people delaying it as long as they can. If the latter is true, will people do the same thing once they have 30 days.

Mr. Quinlan answered that he believes it is a little of both, and reiterated that when a Manufacturer's Statement of Origin is lost it does take more than 15 days. (See Attachment 1)

Representative Johnson asked if there is a charge in the bill for the second 15-day permit and Mr. Quinlan replied he didn't believe so.

Mr. Steven R. Wiechman, representing Kansas Automotive Wreckers Association, gave testimony on HB-2824 and explained to the committee that his organization would prefer a one time 30-day permit, rather than a second 15-day permit.

Mr. Bill Edds of the Department of Revenue stated they are concerned about the standard of good cause that this bill requires for the issuance of the second 15-day permit. He said another concern is that this particular section authorizes a vehicle to fall under laden conditions for 48 hours from the day of issuance of the temporary permit and under the bill the question might arise as to whether or not they could have a second 48-hour authorization period. Mr. Edds commented that the county may not receive the property tax on a vehicle as quickly as what they would have under provisions of the law that authorizes one 15-day permit. Mr. Edds related that his department prefers the 30-day one time permit over a second 15-day permit.

Representative Ron Fox, sponsor of HB-2824, briefed the committee on the bill and said that it, in some cases, allows for an extension of the $15-\mathrm{day}$ permit.

This ended the hearing on HB-2824.

The next order of business was HCR-5057. Representative Leary Johnson, principal sponsor of the resolution, informed the committee that this legislation represents no additional cost to the tax payers of Kansas, but only requires that when the next vehicle license plates are designed, that an appropriate symbol or slogan be placed on the plate to commemorate our war veterans. (See Attachment 2)

Mr. Randall Scott appeared before the committee and testified in favor of HCR-5057. He read testimony which was originally to have been given by Mr. Stan Teasley, Executive Director of The Kansas Veterans Commission. (See Attachment 3)

Mr. Scott told the committee that the Kansas Veterans Commission feels strongly that the freedoms Americans enjoy today, are present to a large extent because of the tremendous sacrifice of American veterans and believes that a Kansas car tag commemorating them would be a proper reminder to all Kansas citizens.

Mr. Chuck Yunker of the Kansas American Legion State Headquarters also testified in favor of HCR-5057. (See Attachment 4) Mr. Yunker conveyed to the committee that the American Legion supports passage of HCR-5057 which would commemorate American veterans on Kansas vehicle license plates.

Mr. Barney M. Aldridge, Quartermaster Adjutant of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Department of Kansas appeared in favor of HCR-5057, and expressed support of the bill which provides recognition for all veterans in Kansas. (See Attachment 5)

Mr. John A. Hill, Disabled American Veterans Department of Kansas, testified in support of HCR-5057, and referred to letters from Mr. Harry G. Wiles, Dr. Carl Fyler, Mr. John Kessler, and Senator Ben Vidricksen, supporting this resolution. (See Attachments 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10)

The meeting was adjourned at 2:10 p.m.

Statement of Jack A. Quinlan on behalf of Kansas Motor Car Dealers Association
In re: House Bill No. 2824 #

Mr. Chairman and members of the Committee, under the present law upon the transfer of ownership of any vehicle, the new owner must immediately register the vehicle under such owner's name. However, that person may have fifteen (15) days from the date of such transfer in which to make application for registration of the vehicle providing that person obtains and secures a temporary registration. This may be issued by the County Treasurer or under K.S.A. 1983 Supp. 8-2409, any dealer may purchase from the Division of Vehicles, fifteen day temporary registration permits which are valid for fifteen days at a cost of \$2.00 each. Before registration of any vehicle, the new owner must have a title which may be an assigned title, or in the case of a new vehicle, a manufacturer's statement of origin. present time, the dealers are experiencing difficulty in securing titles within the fifteen day period with such a temporary registration.

This can be due and is in fact due to a number of things. For example, mail delays; foreign titles or titles which come from another state which are sometimes difficult to secure; clearing the title of all liens, as sometimes financial institu-

tions are slow in releasing the liens they may have against the vehicle. Sometimes the loan application has not yet been approved or the process of the loan is sometimes slow. There are sometimes delays when checks need to clear banks, and, infrequently but sometimes, manufacturer's statement of origin is slow coming from the factory or is lost or mutilated and a duplicate needs to be secured. In short, there are any number of reasons why fifteen days does not seem to be enough time to get a title cleared and transfered to a new owner in order that the new owner may register the vehicle. For this reason, we are asking this Committee to consider favorably House Bill No. 2824.

Mr. Chairman and members of the Committee, there is also a bill in the Senate, Senate Bill No. 633 which was heard just this morning by the Senate Committee on Transportation and Utilities. If you have any questions, we will try to answer those for you. Thank you.

Today we, as a Committee, will review legislation which honors Kansans who have displayed extreme dedication and loyality to their state and country. Today we review legislation which will commemorate war veterans, past, present and future, who were asked to make the ultimate sacrifice in behalf of their country. The subject legislation is simple and represents no additional cost to the tax payers of this state. It only requires that when the next vehicle license plates are designed, that an appropriate symbol or slogan be placed on the plate to commemorate our war veterans.

Thank you for allowing me to appear before this committee this afternoon and to represent the 90,000 plus American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary and Sons of The American Legion members in Kansas. My name is Chuck Yunker and I am the State Public Relations and Youth Activities Director for The Kansas American Legion.

On May 15, 1983 the duly elected delegates to the Kansas American Legion's 65th Annual State Convention unanimously approved our Resolution No. 9, copies of which I provided for you today. House Concurrent Resolution No. 5057 and the Legion's Resolution No. 9 parallel each other with one minor exception: Whereas House Concurrent Resolution No. 5057 seeks a license plate to commemorate the military veterans of Kansas, the Legion's resolution seeks one which would commemorate war veterans of Kansas. The Kansas American Legion has no objection to Resolution 5057, in fact we wholeheartedly support its passage.

Memorials are built to honor the dead; this type of license plate would also honor our deceased veterans, and at the same time pay tribute to the living. We do not believe such a tribute to the 300,000 living veterans in Kansas, eighty percent of whom are war veterans, would set a precedent.
