(Reinhardt)

HB 2832 - Following a call to order by Chairman Joseph C. Harder, the Chairman announced that HB 2832 had recently been assigned to the Committee and that Representative Bill Reinhardt, author of the bill, had requested time to be heard on the bill. He then recognized Representative Reinhardt who explained that HB 2832 gives a formula for setting up summer programs in the USD's for remedial work in math and reading for grades one, two, three, and four. Following Representative Reinhardt's testimony, the Chairman said the bill would be taken under advisement.

HB 3067 - The Chairman then called the Committee's attention to HB 3067 which establishes a 19-member Teaching and School Administration Professional Standards Advisory Board and a 12-member Professional Practices Commission and abolishes the 15-member Professional Teaching Standards Advisory Board, the 13-member School Administrator Professional Standards Advisory Board, and the 17-member Professional Teaching Practices Commission. Mr. Craig Grant of K-NEA was called upon by the Chairman to explain some amendments, Attachment 1, that had been suggested by K-NEA. Mr. Grant stated that the Kansas Association of School Boards had agreed to these amendments. When the Chairman called for action on HB 3067, Senator Winter moved, and Senator Parrish seconded the motion to adopt the conceptual amendments as suggested by Mr. Grant. The Chairman broke a tie vote, and the amendments were adopted. Senator Warren then moved, and Senator Parrish seconded the motion to adopt a technical amendment as explained by Ms. Avis Swartzman, Revisor of Statutes. The amendment was adopted. Senator Winter then made a motion to recommend HB 3067, as amended, favorably for passage. The motion was seconded by Senator Parrish, and the motion carried.

HCR 5077 - When the Chairman asked for the Committee's pleasure regarding HCR 5077, relating to a change in the selection of the State Board of Education from elective to appointive, Senator Warren made a motion to amend HCR 5077 by adding a new subsection (d) on Page 2 which states that "Any community college shall be operated, supervised, and controlled as provided by law". This motion was seconded by Senator Rehorn. After the Chairman announced that the motion had carried, a call for a division confirmed that the motion had carried and the amendment had been adopted.

In response to a request by Revisor of Statutes, Ms. Avis Swartzman, for the adoption of some technical amendments, Senator Bogina moved, and Senator Angell seconded the motion to adopt the amendments as described by the Revisor. The motion carried, and the amendments were adopted.

Senator Winter then moved, and Senator McCray seconded the motion to recommend HCR 5077, as amended, favorably for passage. The motion carried.

HCR 5039 - When the Chairman asked for the Committee's pleasure regarding HCR 5039 relating to curriculum decisions in the academic preparation of secondary students for university, Senator Parrish moved, and Senator Rehorn seconded the motion to recommend HCR 5039 favorably for passage. However, at the request of the Revisor of Statutes, who explained a technical amendment that was needed, Senator Winter moved, and Senator McCray seconded a motion that the technical amendment as described by the Revisor of Statutes be adopted. The motion carried, and the amendment was adopted. The Chairman then referred the Committee's attention to Senator Parrish's primary motion. After Senator Parrish restated her motion to recommend HCR 5039, as amended, favorably for passage, and after Senator Rehorn seconded the motion, the motion carried.

SCR 1624 - When the Chairman called for action on SCR 1624, there was no motion. The Chairman said the resolution will be held in Committee.

SCR 1641 - When the Chairman asked the Committee's pleasure regarding SCR 1641, Senator Kerr made a motion to recommend SCR 1641 favorably for passage. Senator Montgomery seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

SCR 1667 - The Chairman called the Committee's attention to SCR 1667 and requested Mr. Dale Dennis of the State Department of Education to explain the background of SCR 1667 to the Committee. Following Mr. Dennis's explanation, Senator Parrish moved that SCR 1667 be recommended favorably for passage. Senator Rehorn seconded the motion. When the Chairman announced that the motion did not carry, a division was requested. The Chairman then broke a tie vote, and the motion did not carry.

HB 2832 - When the Chairman called for action on HB 2832, Senator McCray made a motion to recommend HB 2832 favorably for passage. This was seconded by Senator Parrish, and the motion carried.

SB 793 - When the Chairman called for action on SB 793, Senator Angell made a conceptual motion to amend the bill by having the cut-off date for counting students for state aid as one day after the ninth week. The motion was seconded by Senator Allen. Senator Parrish then made a substitute motion to recommend the bill for study by an interim committee. This was seconded by Senator Bogina, but the motion did not carry. The Chairman referred the Committee's attention to the primary motion by Senator Angell to amend the bill, and the amendment was adopted. Senator Angell then made a motion to recommend SB 793, as amended, favorably for passage. This motion was seconded by Senator Allen, but when the Chairman announced that the motion had carried, a division was requested. The Chairman then broke a tie vote and announced that the motion had carried.

SB 712 - After a call by the Chairman for action on SB 712, Senator Angell moved to recommend SB 712 favorably for passage, and this motion was seconded by Senator Rehorn. Senator Montgomery offered a substitute motion to recommend the bill for study by an interim committee. This motion was seconded by Senator McCray. When the Chairman announced that the motion had carried, a division was requested. The Chairman then broke a tie vote and ruled that SB 712 would be recommended for study by an interim committee.

The Chairman adjourned the meeting.
