The meeting was called to order by Senator Talkington, Chairman, for further consideration of bills previously heard by the committee.

SENATE BILL 694 - ACTION

The Chairman reviewed the interim committee's recommendation that 10% of a bid submitted by a contractor for DOT projects must go to a disadvantaged business remain in the bill.

Senator Hayden moved that SB 694 be reported favorable for passage; seconded by Senator Norvell and passed.

SENATE BILL 545 - ACTION

After discussing the bill that would encourage the KCC to require utilities to offer discounted electric and natural gas rates to residential customers who conserve power, the committee voted adversely.

Senator Kerr moved that SB 545 be reported adversely; seconded by Senator Burke. The motion carried. Senator Johnston requested to be recorded as voting no.

SENATE BILL 544 - ACTION

Senator Norvell moved to reduce the number of emergency telephone calls that could be made by eligible ratepayers from six to three; seconded by Senator Rehorn. The motion carried.

Senator Norvell moved to increase from \$3 to \$6 the rate to be paid by ratepayers eligible for emergency telephone calls; seconded by Senator Johnston. The motion failed.

Senator Norvell moved to allow eligibility of disadvantaged under the


homestead act to be reduced to \$7,200; seconded by Senator Rehorn. The motion failed.

According to Senator Norvell, Leonard Dodson, National Association of Mature People; Bea Bacon, KS Coalition of Aging; Ruth Lyon, American Association of Retired Persons; Sylvia Hougland, Secretary of Aging; the KS Advisory Council on Aging; and the Silverhaired Legislature have urged passage of SB 544.

Senator Norvell moved that SB 544 be reported favorable for passage; seconded by Senator Rehorn. The motion failed.

Senator Morris moved that SB 544 be reported adversely; seconded by Senator Kerr. The motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 9:53 a.m.
