The meeting was called to order by Senator Talkington, Chairman, for hearings on HB 2663, HB 2860 and HB 3060.

HOUSE BILL 2663 - HEARING AND ACTION

Representative Jayne Aylward explained that HB 2663 allows exemption from registration of all-terrain vehicles when used for agricultural purposes. She recommended two amendments concerning dry weight and that tires have 10 lbs. per square inch of pressure.

Senator Burke moved to amend Line 136 in HB 2663 specifying that the weight be dry weight and by adding that tires have 10 lbs. per square inch of pressure in Line 141; seconded by Senator Norvell. The amendments were adopted.

Bill Edds said the division of vehicles speculated whether provisions should be added for a proper drivers license for operators of all-terrain vehicles and whether or not an age provision should be considered.

Senator Norvell moved that HB 2663 be reported favorable for passage as amended; seconded by Senator Hayden and passed.

HOUSE BILL 2860 - HEARING AND ACTION

Representative Crowell indicated the bill originated when various jobbers of fuels were being audited. He added that the bill will allow users to pay jobbers for special fuels and jobbers, who are bonded, will remit tax.

Bill Edds mentioned the Department of Revenue originally opposed HB 2860, however,

amendments passed in the House make the bill now feasible to the department.

Senator Thiessen moved to place HB 2860 on the consent calendar; seconded by Senator Rehorn. The motion carried.

HOUSE BILL 3060 - HEARING AND ACTION

Bill Edds noted that HB 3060 adds taxation of LP fuel to the other fuels mentioned in the motor fuel tax bill which was passed last year.

Senator Hayden moved that HB 3060 be reported favorable for passage; seconded by Senator Johnston and passed. Senator Norvell requested to be recorded as voting no.

HOUSE BILL 2606 - ACTION

After Col. Bill Moomau answered a question, Senator Morris asked that minutes reflect Col. Moomau's statement that the highway patrol does not attempt to regulate geology students who may pick up rocks or other materials from highways.

Senator Burke moved to amend Line 23 by adding "including the entire right-of-way;" seconded by Senator Norvell. The amendment was adopted.

Senator Norvell moved that HB 2606 be reported favorable for passage as amended; seconded by Senator Burke and passed.

HOUSE BILL 3084 - ACTION

Senator Morris moved to place HB 3084 on the consent calendar; seconded by Senator Burke. The motion carried.


HOUSE BILL 3085 - ACTION
