SUGGESTIONS MADE BY SENATE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE FOR POSSIBLE INTERIM STUDIES DURING THE 1984 INTERIM

- 1. Study to determine whether the state should be involved in arbitration and representing complainants in courts in matters related to wage claim cases. Such a study should focus on the employment standards subprogram of the Department of Human Resources and examine the state's role in enforcing K.S.A. 44-313 et seq and K.S.A. 44-1201 et seq as the statutes relate to wage payment claims and minimum wages/maximum hours claims.
- 2. Investigate the extent to which Job Training Partnership funds are used as "seed money" that place greater demands on the State General Fund. In particular, the study should focus on state aid payments to community colleges and area vocational schools which participate in job training programs and receive federal funds for training participants which can leverage state money as well.
- 3. The Director of Personnel Services, Department of Administration, should review the Department of Human Resources' personnel procedures, with particular attention to hiring practices, especially part-time employees. A report of the findings should be transmitted to the Legislature by the first day of the 1985 session.
- 4. Study the cost effectiveness of the medical assistance program. This study should include a review of (a) the basic services offered by Medicare and Blue Cross/Blue Shield to the Medical Assistance Program; (b) cost-effective alternatives to service provision, including use of existing hospitals to provide ambulatory medical services.
- 5. Study concerning evaluations to determine if a defendant is competent to stand trial. This should include a study of means of financing competency evaluations for indigents. Senate Bill 880, which deals with the subject, was passed by both Houses of the Legislature during the 1984 session. At this writing, it is on the Governor's desk awaiting signature.
- 6. The subcommittee report presented by the members dealing with the budget of the Department of Administration (SB 550) suggested continuation of the budget review process by Ways and Means Committees during the interim, rather than confining that review to the Legislative session. The committee approved that report.


