Representative Kent Ott called the meeting of the Natural Resources Sub-Committee to order for the purpose of hearing amendments to HB 2094 and HB 2095.

Mr. Kent Jackson explained the amendments proposed in HB 2094 by the Fish & Game Commission would allow the Commission to appoint vendors to sell permits, as well as county clerks, thereby making the purchase of permits more available throughout the state. The Commission would charge and retain 25¢ for each permit sold to any person appointed to issue permits.

Regarding HB 2095, Mr. Jackson stated the proposed amendments being considered allows the court to suspend or revoke the convicted person's hunting or fishing license for a period of two years.

The motion was seconded by Representative Kathryn Sughrue.


The motion passed.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL NO. 2095

On page 1, in line 44, following the period, by inserting:
"In the case of any subsequent violations of K.S.A. 32-110a, 32-177, 32-178 or 32-179, and amendments thereto, the court shall suspend or revoke the convicted person's hunting or fishing license for a period of two years in the same manner authorized by section 8."
