The meeting was called to order by Chairman Miller.

Representative Aylward made a motion, seconded by Representative Vancrum, to approve the minutes of the February 6 meeting. The motion carried.

HB2075 - Ceding to the U.S. Concurrent jurisdiction over crimes in national parks

Representative Sughrue made a motion, seconded by Representative Peterson, to report HB2075 favorable for passage. The motion carried.

Representative Hensley explained a proposal requested by the Fraternal Order of the Police which would include into state law a police bill of rights.

Representative Hensley made a motion, seconded by Representative Peterson, to introduce the proposal as a committee bill. The motion carried.

Representative Aylward explained a proposal which is similar to HB2153 which relates to the plumbers licensure act. This proposal is an electrician licensure act.

Representative Aylward made a motion, seconded by Representative Hensley, to introduce this bill as a committee bill. The motion carried.

HB2135 - Death Penalty

Representative Vancrum made a motion, seconded by Representative Ramirez, to delete in lines 201-207 "aggravated kidnapping, aggravated rape and aggravated criminal sodomy". The motion carried.

Representative Sprague made a conceptual motion, seconded by Representative Sallee, to strike New Sec. 5 which would not allow a juror to be pre-emptorily challenged because of feelings on the death penalty.

After much discussion about jurors and that their selection be representative of their area, Representative Hensley made a substitute motion, seconded by Representative Peterson, to insert in line 0103 after "may" the word "not"; on line 0105 after the word "sentence" place a period (.); and strike "only if" in line 0105 and strike lines 0106-0113. The motion lost.

Representative Sprague's original motion was called. The motion lost.

Representative Aylward made a motion, seconded by Representative Eckert, to report HB2135 as amended. A vote was taken; a division was called; the vote was 10-10 with the Chairman casting the tie breaking vote. The motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned.
