Chairman called meeting to order, calling attention to request for a bill that had come in form of a letter to him from Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board, signed by Mary Ann Gabel, Executive Secretary. Basically the request is asking to increase the statutory limitations on application, renewal, and examination fees for social work licensure.

After brief discussion in regard to necessity of proposed increase, Rep. Williams made a motion this bill be introduced, seconded by Rep. Blumenthal. There was brief discussion again, vote taken, motion carried. Request given to revisor, Norman Furse.

Chair recognized Rep. Friedeman in regard to HB 2078.

HB 2078:

Rep. Freideman moved that HB 2078 have action reconsidered, seconded by Rep. Williams. There was discussion in this regard, vote then taken, motion carried.

Rep. Wagnon made a motion that HB 2078 be reported favorably for passage, seconded by Rep. Cribbs. Rep. Wagnon then asked to speak to her motion. She said cutting off 4,000 people from general assistance is a big concern, and further, the SRS budget is now in Ways and Means Committee, and if we hold this bill up in our committee, she said, until March 7th, there will be no time to try and work out the concerns and try to resolve necessary funding by Ways and Means. Vote taken, motion carried.

HB 2186:

Chair gave background on this bill, in that it would make provision for Joint City-County Health Departments to contract with non-profit Mental Health Centers. Rep. Blumenthal moved HB 2186 be passed favorably out of committee. Motion seconded by Rep. Hassler, question called, vote taken, motion carried.

HB 2052:

Chair gave background on HB 2052, saying it would require a six months follow-up reporting on termination of pregnancies.

Rep. Friedeman moved to amend by striking the language in Sec. 1, sub-section (c), lines 0043 through 0058, motion seconded by Rep. Williams. Much discussion followed, vote taken, motion carried. Discussion continued, i.e., language in line 30 is of concern to some, numbers of abortions done, conditions under which abortions are done, etc.

Rep. Runnels moved to amend HB 2052, by inserting language on line 42, "The names and addresses of medical care facilities and persons required to report in this section shall be confidential and may not be disclosed by the secretary.

Motion was seconded by Rep. Wagnon. There was lengthy discussion in regard to this proposed amendment, i.e., would eliminate picketing of clinics that perform abortions; physicians names and hospitals generally not disclosed after other surgeries; is there now a record of medical facilities that perform this service; etc.

Rep. Branson then made a substitute motion that HB 2052 be reported adversely, seconded by Rep. Wagnon. Lengthy discussion again, i.e., much information already being reported, opposition to language in lines 30 through 35; not wishing to have this become a vehicle for other issues; issue should not become a political football, etc.

Question called by Rep. Green, voice vote taken, substitute motion failed.

Chair directed committee back to motion to amend HB 2042 made by Rep. Runnels and Rep. Wagnon, vote taken motion passed. HB 2052 is further amended.

Rep. Friedeman moved that HB 2052 be recommended favorable for passage as amended, seconded by Rep. Williams. Discussion followed.

Rep. Neufeld made a substitute motion to table HB 2052, seconded by Rep. Hassler. Chair noted that motion to table is not debatable, so no discussion allowed. Vote taken, division requested, show of hands indicated 8 for, 10 against, motion to table failed.

Back on motion by Rep. Friedeman and Williams, question called for, vote taken, motion carried. HB 2052 passed favorably as amended.

Chair recognized visiting students this date from CLOSE-UP KANSAS program. Chair had committee note a heavy agenda for meetings next week.

Meeting adjourned at 2:20 p.m., next meeting will be Monday February 25, at 1:30 p.m.

O020 AN ACT requiring certain reports concerning the termination of pregnancies; amending K.S.A. 65-445 and repealing the existing section.

0023 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 65-445 is hereby amended to read as fol-10025 lows: 65-445. (a) Every hospital medical care facility shall keep 10026 written records of all pregnancies which are lawfully terminated 10027 within such hospital the medical care facility and shall annually 10028 submit a written report thereon to the secretary of health and 10029 environment in the manner and form prescribed by said the 10030 secretary. Every person licensed to practice medicine and sur-10031 gery shall keep a record of all pregnancies which are lawfully 10032 terminated by such person in a location other than a medical 10033 care facility and shall annually submit a written report thereon 10034 to the secretary of health and environment in the manner and 10035 form prescribed by the secretary.
