Chairman Bunten called the meeting to order at 12:05.

Bill Wolff of Legislative Research presented a draft review of the special claims against the state. (Attachment 1). These claims have been incorporated into SB 379. The total fiscal note is approximately \$40,000.

Item 16(a) directs University of Kansas to pay Sarah Emery \$800.00 for injuries received by falling into an uncovered manhole on the KU campus. Mr. Wolff pointed out to the committee that Miss Emery filed a law suit after her claim was heard by the committee and that the Senate voted to delete this claim at the request of KU.

Item 16(b) - claim for Virginia McCue for \$15,000 and --

Item 16(c) - claim for \$15,000 relating to the Thornton family. This claim was heard by the committee in 1983 interim, recommended for payment to the '84 session of the Legislature and was in and out various versions of the bill. Ultimately, it was not in the final version of the bill signed by the Governor. At the time of the accident, three claims were filed by various parties relating to the accidents and they were notified to exhaust all other remedies, before claims committee would take up any consideration of the claims. All remedies were exhausted in the summer of '83, at which time Charles Thornton asked that his claim be pursued.

In an effort to clear the committee's files this last summer, the other claimants were notified that their claims were still pending before the committee and asked whether they wanted to proceed. The McCue family did want to proceed, but did not want to have a hearing since their's was the same situation as the Thornton claim. As a result, committee recommended a \$15,000 award to the McCue family. At the same time, Mr. Thornton requested reconsideration to his claim. Having just awarded \$15,000 to the McCue family, the committee felt they could not deny doing the same for the Thornton family.

Supreme Court has determined that State of Kansas is in no way liable; however there was considerable discussion concerning paying the claims as a matter of equity.

There are two additional claims that are not listed in the draft bill, but are included in SB 379. One relates to an accident to a woman at the State Fair in Hutchinson for the amount of \$239.39. The other is for \$406.00 to the Savin Corporation from University of Kansas.

Chairman Bunten told the committee that SB 379 will probably be considered in this committee on Friday, April 12.

A draft bill concerning SRS, was presented and introduction of the bill requested. The bill would allow state of Kansas to borrow from the pool money investment board money to pay off the nursing home debt and then allow for repayment in a span of three years. (Attachment 2)
Representative Shriver moved that the bill be introduced. Seconded by Representative Duncan. Motion carried.

Meeting adjourned at 1:30 p.m.

AN ACT concerning the department of social and rehabilitation services; relating to settlement of a civil lawsuit; making and concerning appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1986; providing for financing and authorizing certain disbursements; imposing certain conditions, restrictions and limitations related thereto.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1.

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL AND REHABILITATION SERVICES

(a) There is appropriated for the above agency from the following special revenue fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1986, all moneys now or hereafter lawfully credited to and available in such fund, except that expenditures shall not exceed the following:

Adult care homes lawsuit settlement fund.....\$12,000,000

- (b) On July 1, 1985, the director of accounts and reports shall transfer \$12,000,000 from the state general fund to the adult care homes lawsuit settlement fund if the adult care homes lawsuit settlement fund does not have an unencumbered balance of \$12,000,000 or more as of June 30, 1985.
- Sec. 2. To provide the moneys for the purposes of the payment of all claims in the lawsuit specified in section 3 in accordance with the settlement agreement, the pooled money investment board is authorized and directed to loan \$12,000,000 to the secretary of social and rehabilitation services, except that no such loan shall be made unless the terms thereof have been approved by the state finance council acting on this matter which is hereby characterized as a matter of legislative delegation and subject

to the guidelines prescribed in subsection (c) of K.S.A. 75-3711c and amendments thereto. The terms of such loan shall provide for repayment on or before July 1, 1988. The pooled money investment board is authorized and directed to use any moneys in the active inactive accounts or time deposits, open accounts, of accounts, the state of Kansas to provide the funds for such loan. Such loan shall bear interest at a rate equal to the interest rate being paid on state inactive account moneys at the time of the making of such loan. The loan principal and interest thereon shall be payable solely from revenues credited to the adult care homes settlement fund, as provided by appropriations acts or otherwise provided by law. Such loan shall not be deemed to be an indebtedness or debt of the state of Kansas within the meaning of section 6 of article 11 of the constitution of the state of Kansas. All such moneys shall be credited to the adult care homes lawsuit settlement fund.

- Sec. 3. (a) There is hereby created in the state treasury the adult care homes lawsuit settlement fund. Moneys credited to the adult care homes lawsuit settlement fund shall be used only for (1) the payment in settlement and full satisfaction of all claims against the secretary and the state of Kansas arising out of Country Club Home, Inc., et al. vs. Robert C. Harder, as Secretary of Social and Rehabilitation Services, case number 81-CV-1041, in the district court of Sedgwick County, Kansas, in accordance with a settlement agreement approved by the court and shall not be used for payment of any judgments entered on any individual claims except as they are a part of the settlement of the entire lawsuit and all claims and judgments arising from this litigation, and (2) the repayment of the loan as provided by the loan agreement approved under section 2.
- (b) Payment made in settlement and full satisfaction of the lawsuit specified in subsection (a) shall not waive any rights the state may have in the matter to reimbursement from the federal department of health and human services or its successor agency. All amounts received from the federal department of

health and human services or its successor agency for reimbursement of amounts paid in settlement and full satisfaction of the lawsuit specified in subsection (a) shall be deposited in the state treasury and credited to the adult care homes lawsuit settlement fund.

Sec. 4. Appeals to exceed limitations. Upon written application to the governor and approval of the state finance council acting on this matter which is hereby characterized as a matter of legislative delegation and subject to the guidelines prescribed in subsection (c) of K.S.A. 75-3711c and amendments thereto, expenditures from special revenue funds may exceed the amounts specified in this act.

Sec. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Kansas register.
