Emalene Correll, Legislative Research, gave a review of SB 72 which would amend KSA 1984 Supp 39-1402 adding five other classes of people who are to report abuse or neglect of residents of certain facilities.

Review of SB 89 followed as the bills parallel to a certain degree. SB 89 is essentially the same as SB 251 that the Committee passed out last year. The bill was recommended by the Silver Haired Legislature. It was suggested that at some point in time it would be appropriate to somehow marry or in some manner combine SB 72 and SB 89.

Norman Furse, from the Office of Revisor of Statutes, reviewed SB 81 which concerns the establishing of a demonstration program authorizing qualified personnel of selected ambulance services to provide manual cardiac defibrillation in emergencies. The training would be approved by the K U Medical Center.

Norman Furse reviewed SB 90 and 93. They were reviewed together, SB 90 pertaining to adults and SB 93 pertaining to children. Both bills require certain information relating to employees be gathered in a central registry with this information to be available to law enforcement agencies, SRS, and certain adult care homes who have employed or are considering employing said individual.

SB 91 was reviewed by Emalene Correll and would authorize photograph ID cards for recipients of assistance, essentially to be used for identification by those receiving cash payment from programs.

SB 92 was reviewed by Norman Furse and it essentially increases the membership of the Governor's Advisory Commission on mental health and retardation services and community mental health programs from 12 to 13, that member to be appointed from the staff of the Secretary of Corrections for a term of 4 years.
