The Chairman opened the floor for action on previously heard bills.

Representative Denise Apt moved to amend SB 563 to raise the limitations of a sealed bid from \$5,000 to \$10,000. Seconded by Representative Jesse Harder. Motion adopted.

Representative Denise Apt moved to amend SB 563 to allow the low outside bidder to be matched by a local bidder within 72 hours if all things are equal. Seconded by Representative Robert D. Miller. Motion adopted after a division vote.

Representative Denise Apt moved to pass SB 563 as amended. Seconded by Representative Bill Reardon. Motion carried.

Representative Vern Williams moved to amend SB 593 to read that any documentary evidence deemed satisfactory by a local school board would be proof of identity of a child enrolling for the first time. Seconded by Representative Anthony Hensley. Motion adopted.

Representative Vern Williams moved to amend SB 593 to keep the word "shall" in line 77, and insert that both the school personnel and the law enforcement agency has to agree if the presence of the school personnel was not in the best interest of the child. Seconded by Representative Elaine Hassler. Motion adopted.

Representative Denise Apt moved to amend SB 593 to read that all information obtained would not be used for any other purpose. Seconded by Representative Robin Leach. Motion adopted.

Representative Vern Williams moved to pass SB 593 as amended. Seconded by Representative Robert D. Miller. Motion carried. Representative Bill Reardon requested that his aye vote be recorded in the minutes.

The Chairman closed action on previously heard bills and announced that the House-Senate Conference Committee would meet in 245-E at 6:00 p.m.

The meeting adjourned at 3:59 p.m. to report back on the House Session floor at four o'clock.
