Representative Denise Apt moved to pass SB 237 favorably. Seconded by Representative Robert D. Miller. Motion adopted.

Representative Jesse Harder moved to pass SB 55 favorably. Seconded by Representative Denise Apt. Motion adopted.

After much discussion, Representative Robin Leach requested that it be recorded in the minutes that the House Education Committee would like the State Board of Education to work with the County on exact enrollment data so that the Counties did not have to pay out-district tuition on students who have dropped out or decreased their credit hours. No action was taken on this request.

Representative Anthony Hensley moved to amend SB 422 to include Washburn University in the bill. Seconded by Representative Charles Laird. Motion adopted.

Representative Anthony Hensley moved to pass SB 422 as amended. Seconded by Representative Charles Laird. Motion carried.

Representative Bill Brady moved to pass SB 500 favorably. Seconded by Representative Denise Apt. Motion carried after much discussion.

Representative Max Moomaw moved to amend SB 649 to have line 30 changed to "...speak, read, write and understand English language." Seconded by Representative Elaine Hassler. Motion adopted.

Representative Max Moomaw moved to pass SB 649 as amended. Seconded by Representative Denise Apt. After much discussion about defining standards for each school board, motion carried.
