MINUTES OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH AND WELFARE
The meeting was called to order byMarvin L. Littlejohn and Chairperson

Chairman called meeting to order. He asked if members had read minutes for this past week. Rep. Green moved the minutes of January 29th and January 30th, February 3, February 4, and February 5th all be adopted as written, seconded by Rep. Freideman, motion carried.

Committee discussion on HB 2663 began:--

Chairman called attention to members recommendations of Secretary Sabol's in regard to HB 2663, i.e., Page 7, Sec. 6, (5), lines 258 and 259, strike words "will not increase", and insert, "minimal"; Page 7, Sec. 6, line 260 and 261 in referring to decrease of availability of health care personnel, the word "minimal" should be inserted.; Page 7, Sec. 6, (3), line 252, the word "institutions" be struck and the words "in-patient facilities" be inserted therein; and the final recommendation of Secy. Sabol's was to assess a fee of \$2500 per application to cover a portion of the program costs.

Chair asked members at this time if anyone had comments in regard to these recommendations. Rep. Wagnon moved to adopt the language Page 7, Sec. 6, (5), lines 258 and 259 to read, "the effect of credentialing of the occupation or profession on the cost of Health Care should be minimal", seconded by Rep. Hassler, motion carried. Rep. Wagnon moved to amend on Page 7, Sec. 6, Sub. (6), lines 260 and 261, amend to read, "the effects of credentialing of the occupation or profession on the availability of health care should be minimal", seconded by Rep. Hassler, motion carried.

Further, to amend by inserting language to assess a \$2500 fee to defray cost of going through the credentialing process. Motion made by Rep. Foster, seconded by Rep. Neufeld. Discussion ensued, i.e., a fee of this amount was difficult to justify; it was suggested that the fee could be determined in correspondence to the number of people in the particular decipline applying; perhaps some smaller groups will merge together, thus making less number of applicants being processed. At this point Secy. Sabol was asked to answer some questions in regard to the fee, and how the \$2500 figure was reached. She stated the fiscal note allows for 2 clerical personnel and after evaluating other fees charged and came up with a fee they felt would not be prohibitive, yet an incentive for them to carefully consider whether or not they wished to proceed with their application. The Department realizes even at \$2500, this fee will not cover the cost of administering the process. They had been apprised that no Federal Funds would be used for this process. Discussion ended.

Rep. Foster made a closing statement, saying that we know where we stand in regard to Federal funding, and he would question that if a group of 10 specialists can't come up with this fee because their group is so small, perhaps they don't need to be credentialed at all. Vote taken, motion carried.

Motion to amend on Page 7, Sec. 6, Sub. (3), line 252 by striking the word "institutions", and inserting in lieu thereof, "in-patient facilities", was made by Rep. Runnels, seconded by Rep. Branson, motion carried.

Discussion continues on HB 2663:--

After a lengthy discussion, Rep. Wagnon made a motion to amend HB 2663, page 7, Sec.6, Sub (2), line 247, strike the word "and", and insert in lieu thereof, "or", and Page 8, Sec. 6, Sub. (9), line 268 strike word "and" and insert in lieu thereof, "or".

Motion seconded by Rep. Runnels. Discussion ensued, vote taken, motion carried.

Discussion ensued regarding amending language on line 335.

Rep. Hassler made a motion to amend, Page 7, Sec.6, Sub. (2), lines 246 and 247, to strike the word "additional". Rep. Runnels made a substitute motion to change the "an" to "a" and to remove comma before the word formal. Discussion ensued in regard to full meaning of formal periof of study and or training, and how and if this would protect the on the job person. The language as proposed would read in lines 246 and 247, both, acquired through a formal period of advanced study or training. Discussion continued. Motion seconded, vote taken, motion carried.

Discussion held in regard to adding a new Section to HB 2663. Rep. O'Neal made a motion to add this new section (e), seconded by Rep. Green, to read "Technical Committee shall complete hearings and shall file a report for any applicant group that has begun the process". Discussion ensued, in regard to where this new section should be inserted. Rep. O'Neal made a conceptional motion, seconded by Rep. Green to insert new section with above language, as the Revisor deems appropriate. Vote taken, motion carried.

Rep. Neufeld made a motion to amend HB 2663, Page 5, Sec.5, line 186, following the word submitted, add the words, "within 120 days". Motion seconded by Rep. Friedeman. Discussion ensued, i.e., how meetings of technical committee are structured, would Legislature being in session have any effect. Rep. Neufeld amended his motion to strike "As soon as possible", and add "within 120 days", seconded by Rep. Friedeman, vote taken, motion carried.

Rep. Neufeld offered a balloon copy of an amendment, Page 2, Sec. 1, Sub. (d)line 56. He stated this amendment is to make it clear the intent of HB 2663 is not to credential those who wish to use religious means to deal with the sick. Language would be added to read, "Health care personnel" does not mean any person who treats the sick by spiritual means through prayer alone in accordance with the tenets or practices of a church or religious denomination or any person who provedes nursing services in accordance with such treatment. Motion seconded by Rep. O'Neal. Discussion ensued, and Mr. Keith Landis was asked to answer questions, i.e., nursing services. He said there are some trained in nursing care to move a patient without injuring them, and likened it to services a caring mother would use for her family. They issue no medications or anything of that nature. Discussion ensued, i.e., Secy. will have to make judgments on exempting these types of groups; concern with other groups wanting exemption; many things don't need Health Care Personnel; who can be credentialed if they don't wish to be credentialed, who would pay the fee. Question called by Rep. Blumenthal, vote taken, motion failed. (See Attachment No.2).

Rep. Pottorff moved to amend HB 2663, Page 2, Sec.3, line 80 through 82, to add language on line 82, after the word state, "holding certification as health care personnel as defined in this act". Motion dies for lack of second.

Rep. Pottorff moved to amend HB 2663, Page 4, Sec. 3 (e), line 132, to delete, "the requirement that all criteria be met", and deletion of the requirement that compliance with rules and regulations that are to be written after the act has been amended be deleted throughout HB 2663. Motion dies for lack of second.

Discussion continues on HB 2663:--

Rep. Pottorff moved to amend HB 2663 further, Page 5, (b), lines 165 through 167, strike the words, "hypothetical examples or testimonials", throughout HB 2663. Motion seconded by Rep. Friedeman. Discussion ensued, i.e., persons who have served on the Technical Committee throughout the state had commented after being contacted by phone they felt strongly these hypothetical examples needs to be left in. Otherwise, anyone can say, this will likely happen without requiring any proof, and it becomes a meaningless type of evidence, but you would still have to deal with it. Vote taken, motion failed.

Discussion held on concerns that dealt with language on Page 7, Sec. 8. There was some question regarding the word "minimal". Staff offered information that a letter from Michael Byington explains this fully, how overlapping can occur. Rep. Runnels stated perhaps the words "legitimate health care personnel" could be used. Discussion continued on the description of legitimate.

Discussions on concerns with line 164, Page 5. Rep. Wagnon asked for explanation on why the Coordinating Council doesn't just deny application, rather than recommending another step that goes on to the office of the Secy. Concerns are with the step between the Technical Committee and the Secy. (The SHCC portion). Staff had members note, if you operate on the premise that only the legislature can deny credentialing and this process was set up by the legislature to incorporate people to ultimately make a recommendation to you to credential or not to credential, that would interrupt that process. If everybody has to make a statement, the Secy. can either override or allow, and then pass this decision on to the legislature, and then the process is complete.

Discussion on clean up language in HB 2663. This will be taken care of by Revisor's staff and no motions are required for these minor changes.

Rep. Green moved that HB 2663 be passed as amended, out of committee. Seconded by Rep. Runnels, motion carried. Rep. Cribbs recorded as a NO vote.
