HB 2675 -- an act providing for vocational education scholarships and vocational education training grants.

Representative Crumbaker explained the bill. It was introduced last summer at the request of vocational schools across the state. At the time, it was decided that if the bill did not move, then Sections 7 through 12 would be removed from the bill. The cost of this portion is about \$100,000.

On a motion by Representative Chronister and a second by Representative Solbach, Sections 7 through 12 were removed from the bill. Representative Chronister then moved that HB 2675, as amended, be recommended favorable for passage. Seconded by Representative Heinemann.

Representative Duncan offered a substitute motion to include proprietary schools. Seconded by Representative Ott. Motion carried.

On a motion by Representative Chronister and a second by Representative Heinemann, HB 2675, as amended, was reported favorable for passage.

SB 686 -- an act relating to state tax levies for institutions; relating to the imposition and disposition thereof and accounting procedures therefor; amending K.S.A. 76-6b04, 76-6b09, 79-2201 and 79-5109 and K.S.A. 1985 Supp. 76-6b10 and repealing the existing sections.

After a brief explanation of the bill, Representative Louis moved that SB 686 be reported favorable for passage. Seconded by Representative Heinemann. Motion carried.

SB 741 -- an act concerning the state board of regents; concerning retirement annuities for faculty members and other officers and employees in the unclassified service; amending K.S.A. 74-4925 and repealing the existing section.

The bill would increase the employer contribution rate for faculty from 6% to 7%. On a motion by Representative Mainey and a second by Representative Solbach, SB 741 was reported favorable for passage.

SB 476 -- an act concerning the court of appeals; increasing the number of judges; amending K.S.A. 20-3002, 20-3005 and 20-3006 and repealing the existing sections.

A proposed amendment was distributed which changes the effective date from 1986 to 1987 (Attachment B). On a motion by Representative Heinemann and a second by Representative Miller, the amendment was adopted.

Representative Heinemann moved to recommend the bill favorable for passage. Seconded by Representative Hoy. On a show of hands vote, the motion carried 10 to 9.

Unless specifically noted, the individual remarks recorded herein have not been transcribed verbatim. Individual remarks as reported herein have not been submitted to the individuals appearing before the committee for editing or corrections.

SB 516 -- Amends Retailers' Sales Tax Act to exempt to the extent of 40% of total selling price the sale of new mobile homes from state and local sales tax.

The fiscal note on SB 516 would be \$500,000. Representative Lowther moved to make the effective date January 1, 1987, which would cut the fiscal note to half. Seconded by Representative Helgerson. Motion failed.

Representative Hamm moved to report SB 516 favorable for passage. Seconded by Representative Helgerson. On a show of hands vote, the motion failed with 9 yeas and 11 nays.

SB 291 -- state aid for provision of instructional television programs for pupils.

Representative Duncan moved to amend the bill, to change the language in Section 4, from "an amount which is equal to 50%" to "an amount not to exceed 50%". Representative Chronister seconded. Motion carried. Representative Duncan told the committee that the TV people realize that the funding of the bill probably will not pass this year, but would like to pass the bill, giving them authority.

There was discussion concerning whether or not there is any specific authority now which would prohibit Department of Education from carrying out this program. Committee also felt there was no reason to pass the bill without the funding. Representative Duncan explained that the education people want it in statute, thinking that funding will come in future years.

On a motion by Representative Duncan and a second by Representative Chronister, the motion failed to report it favorable.
