MINUTES OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON ENERGY AND NATURAL RESOURCES

The meeting was called to order by Representative Ron Fox at

Conferees appearing before the committee:

Chairman Fox began the meeting by explaining the procedure that would be followed this year. Hearings would be held by subcommittees; subcommittees would present a report for adoption by the Standing Committee. Then the Standing Committee would discuss and make any amendments necessary before taking action.

House Bill 2004--Establishment of Kansas coal commission. Representative Holmes distributed copies of the minutes of the Energy Subcommittee meeting (Attachment 1) and an amendment to House Bill 2004.

He then gave the Energy Subcommittee Report.

Representative Holmes, seconded by Representative Rosenau, made a motion to adopt the Subcommittee Report with the proposed amendments as a Committee Report. Another proposed amendment to delete lines 61, 62, and 63 was discussed. Representative Acheson, seconded by Representative Guldner, moved to amend the Subcommittee Report to delete lines 61, 62, and 63. Representative Holmes, seconded by Representative Rosenau, moved to adopt the Subcommittee Report as a Committee Report with the proposed amendments and report it out favorably. The motion carried. Representative Spaniol gave the Natural Resources Subcommittee Reports. Relative to House Bill 2058--Migratory waterfowl habitat stamps, Representative Spaniol noted one recommended amendment to the bill. This would be on page 1, line 36, to strike "or duck" and insert "duck or merganser." This would be in compliance with the federal duck stamp requirements. Representative Spaniol, seconded by Representative Sifers, moved to adopt the Subcommittee Report with the proposed amendment. The motion passed. (Attachment 2) N.R. SUB. 1/26/87

House Bill 2066--Duplicate fishing and hunting licenses. Representative Spaniol recommended to the Standing Committee that this bill be amended to give the option of applying for a duplicate hunting license from the original vendor or by filing an affidavit with the Fish and Game Commission in Pratt, Kansas directly by mail. Representative Spaniol moved that House Bill 2066 as amended be adopted and passed out favorably. Representative Shore seconded and the motion carried. (Attachment 3) N.R. SUB. 1/27/87

House Bill 2067--Non-resident holder of lifetime fishing and hunting licenses eligible for big game permit. Representative Spaniol moved to recommend adoption of the Subcommittee Report and pass it out favorably. Representative Lacey seconded. The motion carried. (Attachment 4) N.R. SUB. 1/27/87

House Bill 2068--Issuance of lifetime hunting or combination hunting and fishing license without hunter's safety course. There was discussion relative to an amendment to make clear that this legislation would apply only to those born on or after July 1, 1957 who are required to comply with the hunter's safety course requirements. (Attachment 5)

Chairman Fox called attention to a request by the Conservation Commission for introduction of a bill dealing with conservation districts in the large counties relative to the mill levy versus commissioners. Representative Spaniol, seconded by Representative Freeman, made a motion to introduce the bill and ask that it be referred back to this committee. The motion passed.

On page 1, in line 35, following "if", by inserting "(1)";
in line 39, following "licenses", by inserting "or (2) by making
oath that such person has purchased a license for the current
year to hunt, trap or fish and has lost or destroyed the same
before the issuer of such license and forwarding the same, with
the certificate of the issuer that such person was issued
license, stating its date and number and the name of the
licensee, together with the appropriate resident or nonresident
duplicate license fee as prescribed by rule and regulation
adopted under K.S.A. 32-164b, and amendments thereto, to the
director of the Kansas fish and game commission at Pratt, Kansas,
and if the right of an applicant to such duplicate is established
to the satisfaction of the director";

And the bill be passed as amended.

HB 2067

Be passed.

HB 2068

On page 1, in line 30, following the period, by inserting a
new sentence as follows: "However, a person shall not hunt in
this state on land other than such person's own land, unless the
person has been issued a certificate of competency and safety in
the handling of firearms.";

And the bill be passed as amended.
