The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Senator Wint Winter, Jr., at 12:45 p.m..

House Bill 2075 - An Act establishing the Kansas training information program.

Discussion was continued from the previous meeting of the Committee on HB 2075.

Senator Langworthy moved that HB 2075 be amended to insure that the social security number and the wage information of individuals remain confidential and be further amended by making that provision an exception to the open records law if deemed necessary by the Revisor. Senator D. Kerr seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The Committee expressed concern about whether the fiscal note on ${\tt HB}$ 2075 will be accurate in two or three years when the follow-up studies are made. The Chairman observed that the Committee may want to address this issue again.

The Committee questioned Section 3(a) of $\underline{\mathsf{HB}}\ 2075$ which states that on or before August 1 of each year a study must be completed and transmitted to the State Board of Education of each person who has finished their educational program the preceding fiscal year. Some Committee members questioned whether this deadline of August 1 is reasonable. Ben Barrett, Legislative Research Department, said that he has recently visited about the time margin with the person in the State Department of Education who would be responsible for the program set forth in $\underline{\mathsf{HB}}\ 2075$ and that person sees no problem in implementing the schedule in the bill.

Senator Salisbury moved that the Committee report HB 2075 favorably for passage as amended. Senator Langworthy seconded the motion. The motion carried.

House Bill 2078 - An Act concerning educational institutions under the supervision and control of the state board of regents; relating to certain research and development projects and activities and expenditures thereunder; acquisition of goods and services; providing certain exemptions

Senator D. Kerr moved that HB 2078 be amended by reinserting the stricken language in New Section 1(b) lines 33 through 39 and by reinserting the stricken language in Section 2 lines 49 through 55 and by qualifying both of these reinsertions by the requirement that the travel addressed in them must be financed 50 percent or more by moneys received from the Kansas technology enterprise corporation, federal agencies or other external sources. Senator Salisbury seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Senator Karr moved to amend HB 2078 in line 31 by striking the word "private" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "other external". Senator Hayden seconded the motion. The motion carried.
