SUBCOMMITTEE REPORT


Subcommittee on Senate Bill Nos. 33, 34, and 35

The subcommittee on Senate Bill Nos. 33, 34, and 35 met at 10:00 a.m. on February 16, 1987, in Room 526, with Senators Bond, Hayden, and Francisco present.

The subcommittee moved to amend its report on S.B. 33 by adding another provision in legislation proposed by the subcommittee to allow special permits for students in respiratory therapy (see subcommittee report on S.B. 33).

By unanimous agreement, the subcommittee recommends that the Senate Committee on Public Health and Welfare report favorable for passage S.B. 34 as drafted.


The subcommittee will meet on Wednesday, February 25, 1986, to further consider S.B. 35.

SUBCOMMITTEE REPORT

Subcommittee on Senate Bill Nos. 33, 34, and 35

The Subcommittee on Senate Bill Nos. 33, 34, and 35 met at 10:00 a.m. on February 9, 1987, and again at 10:00 a.m. February 16 in Room 526, with Senators Bond, Hayden, and Francisco present. Additionally, Senators Kerr and Mulich sat in on the Subcommittee meeting.

The Subcommittee considered Senate Bill No. 33 and makes the following recommendations as a result of deliberations on the bill:

1. The Senate Committee on Public Health and Welfare should request an interim study to prepare legislation that would result in one board responsible for the licensure and regulation of medical doctors, doctors of osteopathic medicine, chiropractors, and podiatrists, and a second board responsible for registering the ancillary health professionals now credentialed by the Board of Healing Arts and appropriate future groups seeking credentialing by the state.
2. The Legislature should take no action to require the Governor to appoint members of the Board of Healing Arts from a list submitted by professional organizations. This recommendation results in retaining the law in its present form.
3. The Senate Committee on Public Health and Welfare is requested to introduce legislation to extend the occupational therapy and respiratory therapy advisory committees for one year to assist with implementation of the 1986 legislation authorizing the registration of occupational therapists and respiratory therapists and to create a temporary permit to authorize respiratory therapists who have met all requirements for registration to use the title of registered respiratory therapist until a registration is actually issued.

The Senate Committee on Public Health and Welfare is requested to include in the legislation extending the occupational therapy and respiratory therapy advisory committees, provision for a "special permit" to allow students enrolled in approved schools of respiratory therapy to practice under the direct supervision of a credentialed respiratory therapist.

4. No action should be taken on Senate Bill No. 33.


