MINUTES OF THE Senate COMMITTEE ON Ways and Means

The meeting was called to order by Senator August "Gus" Bogina at

Conferees appearing before the committee:

SB 162 - An act relating to state tax levies for institutions.

Gary Stotts, Acting Director of Budget, reviewed SB 162. Mr. Stotts stated that SB 162 is part of the Governor's budget recommendation and he distributed copies of Schedule 6 and Schedule 7 from the Budget. Mr. Stotts noted that the amounts involved for FY 1988 would be an addition to the Correction Building Fund (CIBF) of approximately \$2.2 million and, in turn, would be a reduction from the State Institution Building Fund (SIBF) by the same amount. Because of the fiscal year and calendar year change in 1989, there will also be receipts involved in the CIBF of \$933,000 with an offset in the SIBF of the same amount. He also distributed information concerning State General Fund Projects for Corrections and proposed projects to be funded by the CIBF. (Attachment 1)

Senator Gaines expressed concerns regarding the Department of Correction's apparent lack of master planning and Senator Harder indicated that the Joint Committee on State Building Construction is awaiting a report from the State Architect's office regarding estimated size and renovation costs of facilities being considered for use by the Department. This report is expected by the last week in February. It was Senator Harder's view that the state would be well advised to have a permanent CIBF. Mr. Stotts responded to concerns expressed by Senator Johnston by indicating the Governor has asked the Secretary of Corrections for a written plan which will be followed by recommendations to the legislature.

Senator Doyen moved, Senator Harder seconded, that SB 162 be reported favorably for passage. The motion carried by a roll call vote. Senator Feleciano voted no.

SB 163 - An act concerning the Kansas public employees retirement system.

Mr. Stotts reviewed SB 163 and Marshall Crowther, Executive Secretary for Kansas Public Employees Retirement System (KPERS), and Charles Dodson, Executive Director for the Kansas Association of Public Employees (KAPE) answered questions and discussed concerns from the Committee.

Senator Gaines moved, Senator Talkington seconded, to report SB 163 favorably for passage. On a roll call vote, the motion carried.

SB 82 - An act relating to salaries and compensation of certain state officers and employees; providing for a reduction in salaries in certain pay periods chargeable to fiscal year 1987.

Copies of a balloon draft of SB 82, as it stands this date, were distributed. (Attachment 2) Senator Doyen moved, and Senator Talkington seconded, to report SB 82, as written in the balloon draft, favorably for passage.

Following discussion, Senator Talkington made a substitute motion, which was seconded by Senator Feleciano, to delete Section 3 from SB 82. The motion carried by voice vote. The Chairman voted in opposition to the motion.

Senator Talkington made a motion to report SB 82 favorably for passage as amended. The motion was seconded by Senator Kerr. During discussion, Senator Gaines made a conceptual motion to amend SB 82 to make it applicable only to 165 members of the Kansas legislature. Senator Werts seconded the motion. On a voice vote, the motion failed. The original motion by Senator Talkington, seconded by Senator Kerr to report SB 82 favorably for passage as amended failed on a roll call vote.

SB 62 - An act making and concerning appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1987, for the department of social and rehabilitation services and Kansas arts commission.

The Chairman reviewed Substitute for SB 62 (draft 7 RS 0907). Senator Talkington offered a motion which was seconded by Senator Gaines to amend SB 62 with Substitute for SB 62. The motion carried on a voice vote. Senator Talkington moved, Senator Gaines, to report Substitute for SB 62 favorably for passage. The motion passed on a roll call vote.

A motion was made by Senator Doyen and seconded by Senator Gaines to introduce SB 265, by Committee on Ways and Means creating the Eisenhower centennial commission to commemorate the centennial of the birth of Dwight D. Eisenhower. The motion passed on a voice vote.

Senator Doyen moved, Senator Talkington seconded, the approval of the minutes from the February 3, 4, 5, and 10, 1987 meetings. The motion carried on a voice vote.

The Chairman adjourned the meeting at 12:20 p.m.

0020 AN ACT relating to salaries and compensation of certain state  
0021 officers and employees; providing for a reduction in salaries in  
0022 certain pay periods chargeable to fiscal year 1987.

0023 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

0024 Section 1. For the purposes of this act "salaried officers of  
0025 the state" shall mean and include:

- 0026 (a) All constitutional officers of the executive department;
- 0027 (b) all justices and judges of the supreme court, court of  
0028 appeals and the district courts;
- 0029 (c) all members of the senate and house of representatives;
- 0030 (d) the state treasurer;
- 0031 (e) the commissioner of insurance;
- 0032 (f) the secretaries of administration, aging, commerce, cor-  
0033 rections, health and environment, human resources, revenue,  
0034 social and rehabilitation services and transportation and the  
0035 secretary of the state board of agriculture;
- 0036 (g) the chancellor of the university of Kansas and the presi-  
0037 dents of all state universities under the supervision and control  
0038 of the state board of regents;
- 0039 (h) all members of the corporation commission;
- 0040 (i) all members of the state board of tax appeals;
- 0041 (j) all members of the Kansas parole board;
- 0042 (k) the director of the Kansas bureau of investigation;
- 0043 (l) the superintendent of the Kansas highway patrol; and
- 0044 (m) all members of the state board of education.

0050 Sec. 3. The director of accounts and reports shall reduce the

0054 by an amount equal to 3.8% of the amounts authorized by law for

0056 and chargeable to fiscal year 1987.

0057 Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and  
0058 after its publication in the Kansas register.

except that salaried officers of the state who prior to the effective date of this act have voluntarily reduced their salaries by an amount equal to or greater than 3.8% of the amounts authorized by law for such payroll periods shall not be subject to an additional reduction under this section

except that all such officers and employees who prior to the effective date of this act have voluntarily reduced their salaries by an amount equal to or greater than 3.8% of the amounts authorized by law for such payroll periods shall not be subject to an additional reduction under this section

In addition language would be inserted following the period in line 49 and in line 56 providing that the salary reductions under this act would not affect retirement benefits of person's whose salary is reduced.
