MINUTES OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

The meeting was called to order by Representative Denise Apt at

Conferees appearing before the committee:

Chairman Apt called the meeting to order and drew the committee's attention to S.B. 525 relating to school finance.

The chair recognized Representative Crumbaker who offered a conceptual amendment. Representative Crumbaker moved to change from 2 percent to 1 percent the additional budget authority above the 102 percent to 104 percent limit that would be available to a district (subject to a protest petition election). (Page 4, Section C). Representative Smith seconded the motion. Motion carried. Representative Blumenthal asked to be recorded as voting "No".

Representative Crumbaker moved to amend the bill to provide for the averaging of district wealth for a 2-year period rather than for 3 years. Seconded by Representative R. D. Miller. During the discussion that followed Representative Branson opposed the amendment and offered data (Attachment 1) and (Attachment 2) showing money seemed to be more evenly distributed under the 3-year averaging plan. After further discussion a vote was taken and the motion failed.

Representative Bowden moved to amend S.B. 525 by changing the budget limitation from 102 percent to 104 percent to 102 percent to 105 percent. Seconded by Representative Dean. Motion failed.

Representative Dave Miller moved to pass out S.B. 525 favorably as amended. Representative Pottorff seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Chairman Apt asked for approval of the minutes for March 1, 1988 and March 2, 1988. Representative Williams moved the minutes be approved. Seconded by Representative Laird. Motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned by the chair at 4:00 p.m.

The next meeting will be March 16, 1988 at 3:30 p.m. in Room 519-S.
