The minutes of February 16, 17, 18, 22, 23 a.m., 23 p.m., 24, 25 and 26 were approved.

The Committee considered the following bills:

H.B. 2708 - Unlawful to arrange drug sales or purchases using a communication facility

Representative Bideau moved to report H.B. 2708 favorable for passage. Representative O'Neal seconded the motion. The motion passed.

H.B. 2710 - Increase penalty for manufacturing controlled substances and for distributing substances to minors

A motion was made by Representative Bideau to report H.B. 2710 favorable for passage. Representative Jenkins seconded and the motion passed.

H.B. 2880 - Who is protected, the enforcement of such protection and support payments under the protection from abuse act

Amendments to H.B. 2880 were distributed to the Committee. It was proposed to amend Section 1, (1), to read "Restraining the parties from abusing, molesting or interfering with the privacy or rights of each other or of any minor children of the parties". It was also proposed to amend Section 1, (2), to insert on line 50 after the word party, "and further restraining the party not granted possession from entering or remaining upon or in such residence or household".

Representative Bideau moved and Representative Jenkins seconded to adopt the proposed amendments. The motion passed.

A motion was made by Representative Bideau and seconded by Representative Jenkins to report H. B. 2880, as amended, favorably for passage. The motion passed.

H.B. 2881 - Time at which sentence or punishment under a criminal code may be modified

Representative O'Neal moved and Representative Snowbarger seconded to report H.B. 2881, favorably for passage. The motion passed.
