MINUTES OF THE House COMMITTEE ON Local Government

The committee approved the minutes of February 22, 23, 24 and 25, 1988.

Ernie Mosher testified on HB 2670, stating that he recommends the removal of the use of sales tax as shown on page 9, lines 314-318.

A motion was made by Representative Johnson and seconded by Representative Patrick to conceptually strike lines 314-318 of HB 2670 to remove funding of these districts by the use of sales tax. The motion carried.

A motion was made by Representative Patrick and seconded by Representative Johnson to pass HB 2670 as amended. The motion carried.

Chairman Sand appointed Representatives Miller, Bowden and Schauf to a sub-committee to study HB 2946.

A motion was made by Representative Johnson and seconded by Representative Miller to pass HB 2768 and put it on the consent calendar. The motion carried.

A motion was made by Representative Fry and seconded by Representative Kennard to change in line of HB 2767 the word "shall" to the word "may."

A motion was made by Representative Fry and seconded by Representative Kennard to withdraw their motion.

A motion was made by Representative Kennard and seconded by Representative Johnson to add to Section 3 of HB 2767 the effective date of January 1, 1989. The motion carried.

A motion was made by Representative Patrick and seconded by Representative Francisco to table HB 2767. The motion failed.

A motion was made by Representative Larkin and seconded by Representative Johnson to pass HB 2767 as amended. The motion carried, with Representative Patrick recorded as voting "no."

A motion was made by Representative Francisco and seconded by Rep. Sawyer to amend HB 2698 on line 32 of page 1, after the period by inserting a sentence to read as follows: "Notwithstanding the foregoing provision, no person serving in the office of city marshall - chief of police shall be relieved of such office until such person has been provided with an explanation of why such person will not be retrained for another term and an opportunity to respond at a meeting of the council.";
