MINUTES OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH AND WELFARE

Chairman Littlejohn called meeting to order and called attention to legislation that would come before this committee for 1988 Session. In regard to carry-over legislation, two bills (probably) will be worked. New legislation being brought before the committee has been introduced by Interim Committee.

Chairman noted that beginning on page 433 of the Interim Studies Book will indicate needed data for this proposed legislation. There are four bills, 2640, 2641, 2642, 2643.

Chairman noted Agenda for the week of January 19th indicates HB 2464. This bill (a carry-over from 1987), will be briefed, and heard by both opponents and proponents. No action will be taken until the week following testimony.

Chair noted those giving testimony on HB 2464 might carefully plan their testimony so comments would not be repeated. There will be no time for "Me Too" testimony.

Chair then welcomed our new committee member, Belle Borum. He explained to her, he felt this committee is the best in the Legislature and he is very proud of the members and of the work done by them.

Chair recognized Rep. Branson who announced to members that next Thursday January 21st, will be Cholesterol Awareness Day. There will be free cholesterol testing that day, (5th floor), and members and staff of this Public Health and Welfare Committee are exclusively invited to a low cholesterol luncheon, 12:00 noon, 2nd floor, that day. She invited all to attend. A talk will be given by Dr. Carlos Dujovne from KUMC, and he is also the director of Lipit & Arteriosclerosis Prevention Clinic.
