The Minutes of March 31, 1988, were approved by a motion of Senator Morris, seconded by Senator Bond. The motion carried.

The Chairman called the Committee's attention to SB752, concerning the Kansas parimutuel racing act and organizations licensees. Senator Morris moved that in (e), on p. 4, line 134, it be limited to 50%. The motion was seconded by Senator Hoferer. The motion carried.

Senator Bond moved to recommend the bill favorably as amended. The motion was seconded by Senator Strick. The motion carried.

SB354, pertaining to license fees, retailers and class A clubs was considered next by the Committee. Senator Morris moved to report SB354 unfavorably. Seconded by Senator Bond. The motion carried.

Next for consideration was SB360, concerning alcoholic beverage training and service. Senator Morris moved to not recommend SB360 for passage. Senator Bond seconded the motion. The motion carried.

SB479 exempts polygraphists from licensure as private investigators. Senator Morris moved that the bill be not passed. The motion was seconded by Senator Martin. The motion carried.

Regulating time share plans is addressed in HB2835. Senator Bond moved a letter be drafted to request an interim study on the bill and related subjects. Senator Morris seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned.
