The Chairman welcomed Representative George Teagarden, who appeared as author and proponent of HB2810, concerning prohibiting carrying a firearm while intoxicated. He stated that he felt there was a need for this legislation and would appreciate support. The Chairman thanked Representative Teagarden for his appearance.

Senator Martin moved that the penalty provision pertaining to a class B misdemeanor be changed and rather than the "B misdemeanor" that the individual would be subject to his or her weapon being taken away. The motion was seconded by Senator Vidricksen. The motion failed.

Senator Arasmith made the conceptual amendment that the bill be amended to read that the word "loaded" be inserted concerning the firearms. The motion was seconded by Senator Vidricksen. The motion carried.

Senator Vidricksen moved that HB2810 be reported favorably as amended. The motion was seconded by Senator Strick.

Senator Morris moved that the Minutes of April 1, 1988, be approved. The motion was seconded by Senator Strick. The motion carried.
