The Minutes of March 15, April 6, and April 8, 1988, were approved. The motion was made by Senator Martin, and seconded by Senator Arasmith. The motion carried.

There was discussion concerning the topics to be addressed during the interim. A letter requesting such studies will be drafted by staff.

Senator Morris moved that an interim study be done on real property, campgrounds, and the broad issue of timesharing. The motion was seconded by Senator Bond. The motion carried.

The matter of an interim study concerning polygraphists had already been voted upon by the Committee.

It was moved by Senator Bond that a broad study of crimes and punishment in relation to felony convictions in Kansas, to arrive at more fairness and uniformity, be made during the interim. The motion was seconded by Senator Martin. The motion carried.

Senator Morris moved that the Minutes of the Joint Committee Meeting of February 9-10, be approved, as well as the Committee Minutes of February 26, February 29, March 21, March 23, March 30, and April 5, 1988. The motion was seconded by Senator Arasmith. The motion carried.
