MINUTES OF THE Senate COMMITTEE ON Governmental Organization

The meeting was called to order by Senator Vidricksen at

The Chairman called the meeting to order and introduced Arden Ensley to address the committee on the four bills that were up for hearing.

Attention was turned to SB 681 concerning session laws of the State of Kansas. It was pointed out that this bill would clear up policy questions. In line 40 this bill would take out the requirement to distribute session laws to the chaplains of the Senate and the House. Lines 46 and 47 would allow the session laws to be distributed as are needed in whatever office. A conceptual motion was by Senator Gaines and seconded by Senator Strick to provide session laws to first and second class cities and third class cities upon request. Motion carried.

Mr. Ensley moved on to SB 682 relating to Kansas Statutes Annotated and pointed out the one change deleting part of lines 65 and 66. The committee members, in their discussion of this bill, suggested a change in the charge per statute book from \$15 to \$25. (lines 79-81) A motion was made to this effect by Senator Francisco. This was seconded by Senator Gaines and the motion carried.

The committee was briefed on SB 683 relating to Kansas administrative regulations, and SB 684 concerning the permanent journals of the Senate and House of Representatives whereupon a motion was made by Senator Frey to recommend SB 681, SB 682, SB 683, SB 684 favorable for passage. Senator Gaines seconded this and the motion carried.

SB 661 concerning the Legislative Post Audit Act was brought up for action. This bill in essence would change the compliance audit to once a year. Senator Strick made a motion to pass this bill out of committee favorably. It was seconded by Senator Hoferer and motion carried.

The committee then looked at SB 654 relating to certain state officers and employees, concerning personnel of the State Board of Indigents' Defense Services, the Division of Printing and the Division of Architectural Services. A balloon version of this bill was presented from the Revisor and Senator Winter made a motion to add the "clean up language" as shown for Section 4, part (c). This motion was seconded by Senator Hoferer and carried. (Exhibit A) Another motion was made by Senator Winter to delete Section 3, change the title and pass the bill. This was seconded by Senator Hoferer. After some discussion the committee agreed not to take any other action on this bill until later.

A motion to approve the minutes of the February 29 meeting was made by Senator Francisco, seconded by Senator Winter and carried.

The Chairman then adjourned the meeting at 2:31 p.m.

0016 AN ACT relating to certain state officers and employees; con-
0017 cerning personnel of the state board of indigents' defense
0018 services, the division of printing and the division of architec-
0019 tural services; amending K.S.A. 75-1017, 75-1202a and 75-
0020 1202d and K.S.A. 1987 Supp. 22-4524 and repealing the exist-
0021 ing sections.

0022 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

0023 Section 1. K.S.A. 75-1202a is hereby amended to read as
0024 follows: 75-1202a. (a) There is hereby established, within and as
0025 a part of the department of administration, a division of archi-
0026 tectural services, the head of which shall be the director of
0027 architectural services. Under the supervision of the secretary of
0028 administration, the director of architectural services shall ad-
0029 minister the division of architectural services. The director of
0030 architectural services shall be in the unclassified service under
0031 the Kansas civil service act and shall be appointed by the
0032 secretary of administration, with the advice of the state building
0033 advisory commission. *Attorneys and space-management officers*
0034 *of the division of architectural services shall be in the unclas-*
0035 *sified service under the Kansas civil service act. The director of*
0036 *architectural services may appoint an assistant director of ar-*
0037 *chitectural services who shall be in the unclassified service*
0038 *under the Kansas civil service act.*

0039 (b) The director of architectural services shall have appro-
0040 priate administrative and managerial experience and abilities
0041 commensurate with and necessary for the performance of the
0042 responsibilities of the office of director of architectural services.

0043 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 75-1202d is hereby amended to read as fol-
0044 lows: 75-1202d. (a) The director of architectural services shall
0045 attend all meetings of the state building advisory commission

0046 and keep a full and correct record of its proceedings which when
0047 approved by the commission and signed by the chairperson shall
0048 be the official record. The director of architectural services shall
0049 have such powers and duties as may be prescribed or imposed by
0050 the secretary of administration or by law.

0051 (b) Subject to approval by the secretary of administration and
0052 in accordance with appropriation acts, the director of architec-
0053 tural services shall appoint the professional, technical, adminis-
0054 trative, clerical and other personnel of the division of architec-
0055 tural services. *Except as provided in K.S.A. 75-1202a and*
0056 *75-2935 and amendments thereto, all professional and adminis-*
0057 *trative positions of the division of architectural services shall be*
0058 *in the unclassified classified service under the Kansas civil*
0059 *service act. On and after the effective date of this act, all techni-*
0060 *cal, clerical and other nonprofessional positions of the division of*
0061 *architectural services shall be in the classified service under the*
0062 *Kansas civil service act. Each person performing services for the*
0063 *division of architectural services in any such nonprofessional*
0064 *position immediately prior to the effective date of this act shall*
0065 *continue in such position and shall attain permanent status in the*
0066 *classified position without examination and without a proba-*
0067 *tionary period. Such person shall retain all retirement benefits*
0068 *earned prior to the effective date of this act and such person's*
0069 *service shall be deemed to have been continuous. Each person*
0070 *employed on the day preceding the effective date of this act in a*
0071 *professional or administrative position in the division of archi-*
0072 *tectural services, which is placed in the classified service under*
0073 *the Kansas civil service act by this act, shall continue in such*
0074 *position and shall attain permanent status in that classified*
0075 *position without examination and without a probationary*
0076 *period. Such person shall retain all retirement benefits earned*
0077 *prior to the effective date of this act and such person's service*
0078 *shall be deemed to have been continuous.*

0079 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 75-1017 is hereby amended to read as follows:
0080 75-1017. The compensation to be paid employees of the division
0081 of printing shall be no greater than that paid by other printing
0082 and binding offices employing the same class of labor. (a) Except

0083 as otherwise prescribed by law, all employees in the division of
0084 printing shall be in the classified service under the Kansas civil
0085 service act. Subject to, and in accordance with this section and
0086 K.S.A. 75-2938, and amendments thereto, on July 1, 1988, all
0087 positions in the division of printing in the classified service shall
0088 be assigned to job classes and pay ranges.

0089 (b) No employee who is employed in the division of printing
0090 immediately prior to the implementation date for the assign-
0091 ment of job positions and pay ranges pursuant to subsection (a)
0092 shall receive, as a result of such implementation, a rate of
0093 compensation for nonovertime work which, when equated to an
0094 hourly rate, is less than the hourly rate such employee was
0095 receiving for nonovertime work on June 30, 1988.

0096 (c) The standard workweek for classified employees of the
0097 division of printing shall be a 40-hour workweek, and such
0098 employees shall be assigned to a range on the pay plan based
0099 upon a 40-hour workweek. Payment of overtime pay to employ-
0100 ees of the division of printing shall be in accordance with
0101 regulations adopted pursuant to K.S.A. 75-3747, and amend-
0102 ments thereto.

0103 (d) Implementation of the provisions of this section shall not
0104 be deemed a violation of K.S.A. 75-4333, and amendments
0105 thereto.

0106 (e) For the purpose of paying compensation to officers and
0107 employees of the division of printing, unless biweekly payroll
0108 periods are established under K.S.A. 75-5501a, and amendments
0109 thereto, which apply to such officers and employees, the director
0110 of printing shall file a semimonthly payroll with the director of
0111 accounts and reports which shall cover a work period from the
0112 first to the fifteenth, and the sixteenth to the close of the month.
0113 If biweekly payroll periods are so established which apply to
0114 such officers and employees, the director of printing shall file
0115 biweekly payrolls with the director of accounts and reports
0116 therefor. The compensation for semimonthly payrolls shall be
0117 paid to the officers and employees semimonthly on the fifth day
0118 following the end of the preceding semimonthly work period,
0119 and the biweekly earnings shall be paid to officers and employ-

0120 es on the twelfth calendar day following the end of the
0121 biweekly work period.

0122 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 1987 Supp. 22-4524 is hereby amended to read
0123 as follows: 22-4524. (a) There is hereby created the position of
0124 state director of indigents' defense services. The director shall be
0125 *in the unclassified service under the Kansas civil service act,*
0126 *shall* be appointed by the state board of indigents' defense
0127 services and shall devote full time to the performance of the
0128 duties of the office of director.

0129 (b) The state director of indigents' defense services, *the*
0130 *assistant director* and all ~~other officers and employees attorneys~~
0131 appointed or employed by the state board of indigents' defense
0132 services shall be in the unclassified service under the Kansas
0133 civil service act. *All other officers and employees of the board*
0134 *shall be in the classified service.*

0135 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 75-1017, 75-1202a and 75-1202d and K.S.A.
0136 1987 Supp. 22-4524 are hereby repealed.

0137 Sec. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and
0138 after its publication in the statute book.

(c) Each person employed on the day preceding the effective date of this act who is an officer or employee of the board, which is placed in the classified service under the Kansas civil service act by this act, shall continue in such position and shall attain permanent status in that classified position without examination and without a probationary period. Such person shall retain all retirement benefits earned prior to the effective date of this act and such person's service shall be deemed to have been continuous.
