MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY SUBCOMMITTEE #2

House Bill 2943 which states that no advance payment of a docket fee shall be required was discussed at length by the subcommittee. Representative David Heinemann entered the discussion after the committee had amended and recommended the bill to the full committee. He felt the bill should be recommended in its present form. Committee decided to request the chairman to consult with the Judicial Administrator.

House Bill 3078, a cleanup bill removing the word "not" was recommended to the full committee. Senator Feleciano made the motion, seconded by Senator Parrish and passed.

House Bill 2860 introduced to clarify child support payments at age 18 and attending high school was reviewed, and a conceptual motion was made to amend Section 1 (a) (1) (A) to allow parents, who have written agreements to pay support beyond the time the child reaches 18 years of age, to request the court to review those agreements to allow for child support payments to extend to June 1 of the school year in which the child becomes 18.

Motion was made by Senator Talkington, seconded by Senator Parrish, and passed.

House Bill 2866 which concerns the same subject was covered in the above conceptual motion; moved by Senator Talkington and seconded by Senator Parrish and passed.

House Bills 2860 and 2866 were recommended to the full committee as amended. Motion was made by Senator Talkington and seconded by Senator Parrish.
