MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

The meeting was called to order by SENATOR AUGUST "GUS" BOGINA at

The Vice-Chairman, Senator Werts, called the meeting to order.

SB 550 - Appropriations for FY 89, department of administration, finance
council, department of wildlife and parks, corporation commission
and historical society. (CONTINUATION)

The Vice-Chairman called for the continuation of the Subcommittee Report on SB 550. Senator Feleciano moved, Senator Kerr seconded, the introduction of a bill, as requested by the Department of Administration, to combine the Computer Services Fund and the Communications Services Fund into a single fund. The motion carried on a voice vote.

In regard to the Department of Wildlife and Parks, Secretary Meinen responded to a question by stating that through his reorganization water safety is one of the issues he will address.

There was discussion regarding the \$1,092,512 recommended by the Governor for capital improvement projects in FY 1989 to be funded from the EDIF. One opinion expressed was that the projects should be funded from the State General Fund (SGF), another was that for economic development there probably is no factor more important than an adequate supply of quality water for domestic, industrial and recreational uses. Senator Winter expressed his discomfort with the recommending of or acquiescing to, directly or indirectly, the funding of the capital improvement projects from EDIF. He stated he would feel more comfortable deferring approval of the Subcommittee Report until the entire Committee is present.

Senator Winter offered a motion which would amend the Subcommittee Report on SB 550, Kansas Corporation Commission for FY 1989, Senate Subcommittee Recommendation number five, to request the Kansas Corporation Commission to provide, before the end of the 1988 Session, an analysis of whether any of the projects currently funded from the EDIF might be eligible for any part of the funding under the oil overcharge funds. The motion was seconded by Senator Feleciano. The motion carried on a voice vote.

In regard to the State Historical Society, Senator Werts made a motion to change the first word of the fourth Senate Subcommittee Recommendation for FY 1989 from "Pending" to "Assuming". The motion was seconded by Senator Kerr and passed on a voice vote.

The Chairman stated that action on the Subcommittee Report on SB 550 would be postponed.

The meeting was adjourned.
